HOME.

The International Conference to discuss the question of safety at sea, which was convened at London on Monday, during which he was unanimously appointed. Leading up to the final question, he declared: "We own no loyalty except to the King, and if we are to be loyal to the King, we must be loyal to the King's law."

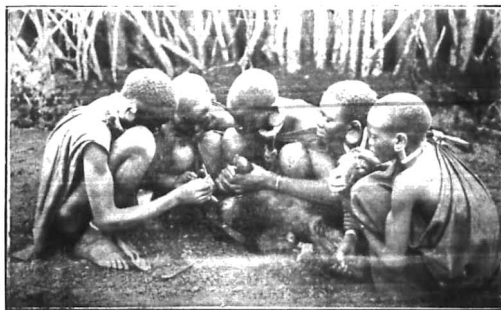

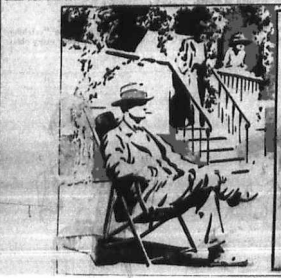

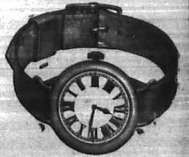

AN EMPIRE BUILDER'S END.

The Statesman's Funeral.

MEMORIAL SERVICE IN THE ABBEY.

[UNBROKEN NEWS'S ASSOCI.]

After a consultation between the relatives of the late Lord Strathcona and the Colonial Office, it was announced that the body will be buried in Elizabethan Cemetery, The Dean Abbey, but by the desire of the deceased will be buried beside his wife, so the definite offer had to be gratefully declined. A funeral service, however, will be held in the Abbey on Monday.

Mr. Harcourt has sent a telegram to the Duke of Connaught conveying the sympathy of the Imperial Government to Canada on the loss of Lord Strathcona.

Out of honour for the loss of the statesman, the Canadian Parliament was adjourned. Mr. Borden, the Prime Minister, and Sir Wilfrid Laurier paying him eloquent tributes.

Speeches were delivered last night in England by Mr. Harcourt and Mr. Austen Chamberlain, who referred in glowing terms to the Canadian statesman.

Lord Strathcona's funeral took place on Tuesday afternoon, the ceremony being marked by numerous manifestations of mourning from all parts of the Empire. A memorial service was first held in Westminster Abbey, this being simple, yet impressive. The Duke and Queen were represented, as well as other members of the royal family. The congregation included members of the House of Lords and the House of Commons, also members of the Colonial Parliaments, together with British Ambassadors and public servants, besides representatives of all classes of the public.

The funeral was held at Highgate Cemetery, a wreath sent by Queen Alexandra being carried in front of the coffin. The pall-bearers comprised—Mr. Harcourt, Secretary of State for the Colonies; Lord Lansdowne, the Earl of Aberdeen, Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, the Duke of Devonshire, the Earl of Minto, and the Lord Mayor of London Sir V. Bowdler. Lord Curzon was prevented from taking a share in the proceedings, owing to an attack of fever. There were large crowds assembled along the streets leading from the house of descent in Grosvenor Square to the Abbey, and after the memorial service the cortege proceeded to Highgate, being greeted every where by marks of respect. There was a magnificent display of wreaths on the grave.

SPECIAL MEMOIR.

Lord Strathcona was indeed a noteworthy man and was one of the world's "grand old men"—he was born in Scotland in 1820. A writer has said in his presence, one had feeling almost of awe, for before Queen Victoria's name to the throne Lord Strathcona was merely young Donald Smith in those days—had taken what was at that time an adventurous step, and had sailed on the long voyage across the Atlantic to the shores of Canada, having obtained the services of the Hudson's Bay Company. In the year 1839 he was sharing in the important foundation-work of Canada which was done by those brave pioneers, many of whom, unlike Lord Strathcona, accomplished their work in obscurity, and died unknown to the larger world. His most conspicuous work was done in the great North-West of Canada, where he settled, and the opening of that vast territory, was chiefly due to his work. He sprang the original movement which led to the settlement of the North-West, and he was the first to venture to inquire into the rising waters of the Red River. In 1850, when he secured a permanent settlement, this evening which would undoubtedly have been a serious catastrophe to the early and progress of Canada. He represented Montreal West in the Canadian Commons for three years, previously being the member for Kingston, and when the House was broken up he pressed him to fit out and lead, at his own expense, 600 mounted men to serve in South Africa—and Strathcona's horse were all men from the North-West. The rapid growth of railways in the remote parts of the colony—a principal factor in developing its prosperity, associated with his name—was largely due to his help to make the Canadian Pacific Railway a wonder of the age.

Lord Strathcona was one of those loyal Canadians who helped give the life to that old Dominion. Canada was a country where a person was frozen to death in winter, and with ponds that Canadians preferred their own winters to those in England, the atmosphere of temperature being less trying on account of the drier atmosphere in Canada. He was absent on the outbreak of the great opportunity of Canada. He would say: "You have to dig pretty hard before you come to the gold, but the gold is there, and it is to be had if the digger is hardy." He believed in the old command: "Trust in Providence, and have your powder dry." The "Grand Old Man" of Canada became Governor of the Province, the Company and director of the Canadian Pacific and other Canadian railways, and he was a member of the Aberdeen University and the McGill University.
