THE KING'S SPEECH.

MESSAGE TO THE DOMINIONS.

India's Fine Loyalty.

PRINCELY OFFERS.

EXTRAORDINARY ENTHUSIASM.

(THROUGH MONTAGU'S AGENCY.)

London, Wednesday.

Following is the message of the King to the self-governing dominions:

During the past few weeks, the peoples of my whole Empire have moved with one mind and purpose to confront and overthrow the unparalleled assault upon the continuity of civilization and the peace of mankind. The calmness and confidence of my peoples, my resolve throughout has been cast on the side of peace. My ministers earnestly strove to allay the causes of strife and suppress the differences wherever and whenever they were not concerned. Had I stood aside when, in defiance of pledges to which my kingdom was party, the soil of Belgium was violated, for cities laid waste, than the very life of the French nation was threatened with extinction, I should have sacrificed my honour, given to destruction the liberties of my Empire, and pledged my word to rulers and peoples to the common heritage of Great Britain and the Empire. My peoples in the self-governing dominions have shown, beyond all doubt, that they wholeheartedly endorse the grave decision which it was necessary to take. My personal knowledge of the loyalty and devotion of my overseas dominions had led me to expect they would cheerfully make the great efforts, and bear the great sacrifices which the present conflict entails. The full measure in which they placed their services and resources at my disposal fills me with gratitude, and I am proud to be able to show to the world that my peoples overseas are as determined as the people of the United Kingdom to prosecute a just cause to a successful end. The Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia and the Dominion of New Zealand have placed at my disposal their naval forces, which have already rendered good service for the Empire. Strong expeditionary forces are being prepared in Canada, Australia and New Zealand for service at the front, and the Union of South Africa has released all British troops and undertaken important military responsibilities the discharge of which will be of the utmost value to the Empire. Newfoundland has doubled the numbers of its branch of the Royal Canadian Mounted Corps, and sending a detachment to take part in the operations at the front. From the Dominion and Provincial Governments of Canada, large and welcome gifts of supplies are on their way for the use of my naval and military forces, and for the relief of distress in the United Kingdom which must inevitably follow the close of war. All parts of my overseas Dominions have thus demonstrated in the most unmistakable manner the fundamental unity of the Empire, amidst all the diversity of situation and circumstance.

Addressing the Indian people the King says: Paramount regard for treaty-faith and the pledged word of rulers and peoples is the common bond of the Empire and India. Among many incidents that have marked the unanimous uprising of the populations of my Empire in defence of the common cause of the Empire, I have moved me more than the passionate devotion to my Throne expressed both by my Indian subjects and by the Princes, Chiefs and Rulers of India and their prodigal offers of their lives and their resources in the cause of the Realm. Their unreserved devotion to the Empire in conflict has inspired me and inspired to the highest pitch the love and devotion which, as I well know, have ever linked my Indian subjects and myself.

Sir Petaip Singh insists on serving the King-Empire despite his seventy years. His nephew, the Maharaja, aged sixteen, goes with him. All these have already joined expeditionary forces.

The Maharaja of Gwalior, Chief of Jash & Dholpur, and the heir apparent of Palampur, were to their great regret prevented from leaving their state. Twenty-seven of the larger native states maintain Imperial service troops, and the service of every corps was immediately placed at the disposal of the Indian Government on the outbreak of war. The Viceroy has accepted from twelve states a contingent of cavalry, infantry, sappers and transport, also camel corps from Bikaner. Most of these have already embarked. Following are particular instances of generosity and eager loyalty: Chief of various Durbars are providing a hospital ship to be given the "Loyalty" for the use of the expeditionary force. The Maharaja of Mysore has called up fifty lakhs for expenditure upon expeditionary force. The Chief of Gwalior, besides sharing expenses of the hospital ship, has provided which originated with him and the Begum of Bhopal, has offered the Indian Government large sums of money and to provide equipment and the Chief of Cawnpore, Bahadur, Oudha, Gwalior and Indore have given largess to the Prince of Wales' Fund. The Maharaja of Casmir, not content with contributions to Indian funds, presided over a meeting of twenty thousand people, and delivered a stirring speech, in response to which his subjects were enlisted. The Maharaja of Holkar of Indore offers, free of charge, all the horses in his State Army suitable for Government purpose. Horses are also offered to the Indian Government by Jamnagar and other Bombay States. Every Chief in the Bombay Presidency has placed his State's resources at the disposal of Government, and all have contributed to the relief fund. Local messages and offers have also been received from the Mehta of Chitral, Khyber Rifles. Letters from most remote states in India are all marked by a deep desire to assist the British Government, however small in its form of need. From beyond the Indian borders, generous offers of assistance have been received; from Nepal the military resources of the state are placed at the disposal of the British Government. The Prime Minister offers rupees three lakhs to the Viceroy for machine guns and the field equipment for the Indian Army, besides large donations from his private purse, to the Prince of Wales' Fund, and the Imperial Indian Relief Fund.

The fourth Gurkha Rifles, of which the Prime Minister is Honorary Colonel, has offered fifty thousand rupees for machine guns and other equipment for the Indian Army on service. The Dala Lama of Tibet offers a thousand Tibetans, stating that the Lamas in Tibet are offering prayers for the success of the British Army. The same spirit has prevailed throughout British India; hundreds of telegrams and letters to the Viceroy express loyalty and a desire many hundreds have also been received by local administrations. Melbourne, Sunday.
Admiral Patey reports that the Australian expedition occupied Herberstoboch this morning, unopposed.

Mr. Harcourt announces that Admiral Patey's Australian squadron hoisted the Union Jack at Herberstoboch without opposition. A naval landing party, under Commander J. Bursford established themselves on shore. This was done without the enemy's knowledge. Herberstoboch is the capital of New Pommern (New Britain) in the Bismarck Archipelago.

In proceeding to destroy the wireless station, the progress of the party was stoutly opposed. It had to fight for four miles through bush, the bush being in many places very thick. The German officer commanding trenches five hundred yards from the station surrendered unconditionally. Guns have been landed and steps taken to capture the station. The casualties were: Lieut. Commander Ellwell, and two of the Australian reserves killed, and three wounded. The German casualties are unknown. There are 27 German prisoners.

The Australians captured the wireless station of Herberstoboch (the capital of the island New Pommern) in the Bismarck Archipelago (New Guinea) after eighteen hours bush-fighting. The Australian garrison Herberstoboch. Two sections killed and two wounded were our casualties.

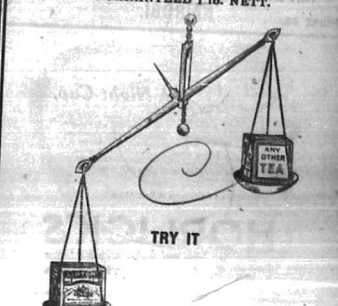
