GREAT BATTLE OF AISNE.

OBSTINATE REPULSES AGAINST ODDS.

FIERCE FIGHTING.

Allies Progress Continues Steadily.

SEVERE GERMAN LOSSES.

[Through Berlin's Agency.]

London, Friday.

A Paris communique announces that in the absence of a general action of the right wing against the enemy's corps was proceeding.

A further communique from Paris says that the Germans are being repulsed by reinforced from the centre and from Lorraine. There are no important modifications on the north of the Aisne, but we advanced in the centre.

A Paris communique speaking of the Argonne situation announces that the position is unchanged. We are masters of the heights of the Meuse. On the south of Verdun our troops advanced into the Beaumont region.

London, Saturday—Noon.

The Press Bureau reports that there has been much activity by the enemy. All along the line there have been some heavy counter-attacks which have all been repulsed with considerable loss inflicted on the enemy.

A Paris communique says that on our left a most violent battle continues between the rivers Somme and Oise and the town of Soissons. The situation in our centre remains unchanged.

A Paris communique reports that the enemy succeeded in crossing the Meuse, but our offensive action has already for the most part driven the Germans back over the river. Our attacks further south have not ceased to progress. The fourteenth German Corps has fallen back, suffering great loss.

London, Saturday—Night.

A Paris communique announces that the forces of the enemy in Lorraine and the Vosges appear to have been reduced. Some detachments which had driven back our advance posts have been repulsed by our reserves.

Telegrams from Paris say that eleven the previous evening on our left wing in the region north-west of Nancy our advanced troops came in contact with a superior force of the enemy and were obliged to give a little ground, but reinforced by fresh troops they resumed the offensive vigorously, the struggle in this region assuming a particularly violent character.

There is nothing new in our centre. On tonight the enemy began to yield before the attacks of our troops from Nancy and Toul, the enemy retiring towards the river Bisp-de-Mai. The action continues on the heights of the Meuse. The Germans were needed in reaching St. Mihiel, but failed to cross the Meuse.

Paris, Sunday.

It was officially stated last evening that the enemy attacked along the whole line, and were everywhere repulsed. We are progressing on the left wing. The situation is stationary on the Meuse. We continue to gain ground at Woerwa.

London, Sunday.

A Paris communique states that on our left our troops are making considerable progress. The enemy made extremely violent attacks between Maie and the Somme. After some bayonet charges they were all repulsed.

A later communique from Paris reports that in many places the French and Ger-

man trenches are only a hundred metres apart. The Prussian Guard on our centre from Rheims to Soissons unsuccessfully attacked but were hurled back.

A Paris communique says that the enemy made a successful attack near St. Menesgod, but by the end of the day we regained our position on the ground. There is no activity between the Argonne and the Meuse, no change on the heights of the Vosges.

The Press Bureau, reporting on the Allies' situation in France says that the position is satisfactory. Counter-attacks on the British front were beaten back with heavy losses to the enemy.

London, Monday.

A Paris communique, issued by the Ministry of War at 11 o'clock last evening, states that from the night of Sept. 20 till Sept. 27 the Germans along the whole front incessantly attacked, with extraordinary violence, day and night, evidently trying to break the Allies' line, with a uniformity denoting instructions from a high commander who must find a solution of the battle. Not only have they not succeeded, but we took a big, some cannon, and numerous prisoners. The morale of our troops, despite the fatigue of the unintermitted struggle, is excellent. The commanders over have difficulty in restraining the men's desire to come to grips with the enemy sheltered in defensive positions.

A descriptive statement from the British head-quarters, dated Sept. 25, says: For four days there has been a comparative lull, accompanied by a spell of fine weather. The nights are now much colder. The arrival of fresh troops has enabled men who have been in the firing line for some time to be relieved, several units have consequently received their baptism of fire. It appears that on Sunday, Sept. 20, German infantry fired into each other, when making a crossing advance in the dark. Action on Monday was practically confined to the artillery, our guns driving away the enemy who were endeavouring to construct a molehill. The Germans were expending much heavy shell bombarding a village. It was ascertained that, during the night, the enemy deserted some trenches, leaving some hundred dead and wounded, and quantities of equipment. They had withdrawn to some distance. Tuesday was one of our most successful days. There was less artillery fire, although the Germans gave the village a taste of the "Jack Johnsons," as the gas-howitzer shells are called.

An official communique, issued in Paris at eleven o'clock in the evening, reports that on the left wing the situation is stationary. In the centre our troops successfully repulsed further very violent attacks. On the heights of the Meuse we progressed slightly. A dense fog has obscured the Vosges. The position is unchanged in Lorraine and in the Vosges district.

A further Paris communique says that there is no change in the Argonne. There is comparative calm along the front, but at certain points, notably between the Aisne and the Argonne, the enemy have made some violent attacks which have been repulsed.

Paris, Monday.

It is stated that two battalions of the Prussian Guards were annihilated in a great attack on Sept. 25.

London, Monday.

A courier from Orléans reports that Brussels is full of German troops who have been brought up from the south exhausted.

London, Tuesday.

From headquarters a descriptive report from an eye-witness issued this afternoon says that Wednesday the 23rd, a perfect autumn day, was almost uneventful except for heavy rain, which fell early (about 11 miles from Paris). The absence of wind gave the airman a great chance. They killed and stampeded some of the enemy's artillery horses. The fall continued on Thursday. The German airman dropped heavy shells near Parisian (?) The French, British and German aeroplanes were most active at 4,000 feet the anti-aircraft guns. The Germans are now inclined to concentrate the dropping of shells on definite areas hoping to find either the Allies' guns or where the British are billeted. The result will be to give work for local batteries.

The Press Bureau states that there is practically no change in the situation. The Allied left have had very heavy fighting, but are not holding their own. A Paris communique states that on our left wing on the north of the Somme and the Oise the enemy made several attacks by night all were repulsed. There is no change north of the Aisne. The enemy on our centre confined themselves to heavy shelling between the rivers Argonne and Meuse. We made slight progress with notable change along the Woerwa and in Lorraine and the Vosges.

London, Wednesday.

A communique issued in Paris at eleven o'clock last evening says the situation is unchanged. [OFFICIAL.] London, Tuesday.

The following has been received from the Press Bureau: On Sunday night the enemy attacked our lines with even more vigor, but no more success. The situation is unchanged. The Germans have gained no ground and the French have advanced in places.—HARCOCK.

London, Wednesday.

A Paris communique states, the action on our left continues to develop more and more towards the north. The enemy on the Oise and Aisne vigorously attacked Tracy-le-Mont, and have been repulsed with severe loss. There is a lull in the centre from Rheims to the Meuse. Violent fighting is proceeding in the Vosges region. We have advanced at several points, especially to the east of Saint Mihiel. There is no change in Lorraine and the Vosges.

It was officially stated in Paris, at 11 o'clock last evening, that the general situation was satisfactory. There is no perceptible change on our front except Southern Woerwa, where we have occupied Siechepfer (?) and advanced to the slopes of Rept-de-Mad.

ANOTHER COLONY.

New Guinea Taken.

London, Friday.

ADMIRALTY REPORT.

[Through Berlin's Agency.]

London, Friday.

The Admiralty Press Bureau reports that the preliminary investigation into the loss relative to the sinking of the cruisers from reports obtained from the enemy surviving officers. The sinking of the "Hogue" and "Cressy" was the ordinary hazard of patrolling duty. The "Hogue" and "Cressy" were sunk because they were not adequately equipped, endeavouring to save life, thus becoming easy and certain targets for further submarine attacks.

Modern naval warfare is presenting so many new, strange situations that errors of judgment of this character are pardonable, but it has been necessary to point out for future guidance that the conditions when a vessel of the squadron is injured in a successful effort to capture a submarine attack are analogous to those occurring in action, and the rule of leaving disabled ships to their own resources is applicable. Small craft, however, should be directed by wireless to those resources. The loss of sixty officers and 1,400 men would not be grudging if it occurred in open action. The absence of an engagement did not prevent the display of discipline and cheerful courage ever ready to sacrifice in the service of the cruisers; duty was the essential part for the control on the sea; men's lives were being sacrificed to the requirements of His Majesty's service as an affair had occurred in a general action.

The "Aboukir" was struck at 8.25 in the morning. When it was seen that the "Aboukir" was in danger of sinking, the "Hogue" and "Cressy" sent bows, and when they were returning filled with the "Aboukir" men. The "Hogue" was struck apparently in the magazine. The men of the "Cressy" observed the periscopes of submarines some three hundred yards of the "Cressy" opened fire, and the engines were ordered full speed ahead to succeed in ramming the submarine. The "Cressy" only struck a single time, the submarine sank, but an officer thinks that the "Cressy" only struck floating timber. The men on deck observed thinking that the submarine was hit. The "Cressy" thus manoeuvred to render assistance to the "Hogue" and the "Aboukir" when another periscope was seen. The torpedo exploded missed at a range of five hundred yards, the "Cressy" was then struck a third time a quarter of an hour after the first. Hit the water room. The "Cressy" sank at 7.55 a.m. The "Aboukir" sank in thirty-five minutes, the "Hogue" in forty-five minutes, and the "Cressy" in forty-five minutes.

Besides the officers and warrant officers saved from the three sunken cruisers the Admiralty has issued a list of 779 men saved.

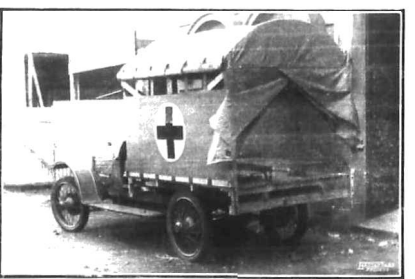

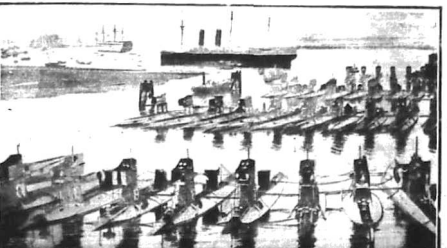

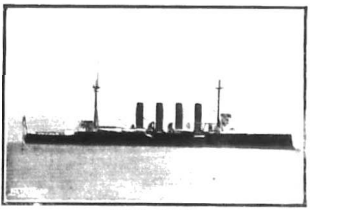

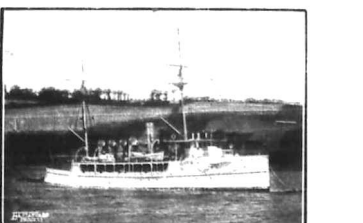

ACROSS GERMANY IN WAR TIME.

PARIS DEFENCES. A GENERAL OUTLINE. A FAST DIFFERENCE.

In view of the difficulty of obtaining an authentic and impartial account of the condition of affairs in Germany since the outbreak of war, exceptional interest attaches to the narrative of Dr. Franklin Martin, of Chicago, Secretary-General of the Congress of Science, held in London in the last week of July. Dr. Martin went to Munich to bring home the story of the recent operations, by Mr. John Moran, of New York, a man who had been handicapped from various causes. He travelled by Holland, and he tells us that he was hardly enough to secure a passport, by which means the remainder of the journey to Munich, where they arrived on Aug. 18. Meanwhile, an order had been issued by the military authorities that no one be allowed to cross the frontier except by order of military staff. Dr. Martin continues:— "I left Munich with six more men of the Ministry (Mr. and Mrs. Moran remaining in Munich) but not two gallons of food." I supposed, I had promised my hosts to see their friends, and so they gave me an escort on the return, going as far as I would pay double the price for the gasoline that he could get from private sources and also pay liberally for the fares. After getting safely out of Munich he reached to the station, where he found a railway back to our destination. At other times we secured a sufficient supply of food from some petty dealer.

Our return journey, after keeping a guard against any one suspicious, was as expected a very guarded ledge, and he asked to accompany our party. This was not asked to give an account of our previous life. We were requested to pay our money back once, and that the remainder of the Bavarian border on our return trip will be reached Cologne, and apparatus will be the only one.

We arrived at Cologne after dark on Tuesday night, after having gone through the railway gates, and decided to push on to Dresden. It was not our chauffeur that night. Here we were stopped at a point of our departure. We crossed intermediate that we were apparently abandoned since our outward trip. The highway was congested with troops, and the army headquarters had made out of Cologne toward the Rhine. We were not permitted to show our papers. Half a mile further on our chauffeur was threatened by a soldier who forced us to get out of the car, and we were stopped a dozen times. From the appearance of everything we could easily recognize the situation to be that of a great battle-field, and of course we were.

The cause of our courteous treatment on our last day over the war highway, where soldiers and civilians alike were stopped aside for a while, was revealed on Wednesday morning when the soldier who accompanied us, a little German who was in the train, told us that he was sent to remove the flag of Alsace to correct. This daily flag was our only one on our entire trip. It means that an order had been issued by the Emperor that German flags should be removed from the area of all military officials and especially our own. The fact that we had no flag and that we were to be treated as foreigners was a very interesting fact which we were to see in France.
