STEADY PROGRESS OF THE ALLIES

Stories from Eye-Witnesses of the Great Struggle.

AEROPLANE DUELS.

Germans Lose Heavily in Fierce Engagement.

MANY PRISONERS TAKEN.

[REUTERS BRUSSELS' AGENT.]

The Press Bureau gives the story of an eye-witness with the British headquarters, who describes the operations from Wednesday, Sept. 30. There, he says, a gradual development of the situation. Only slight attacks were made by the enemy and there was occasional artillery. Thursday was a perfect Autumn day, and very peaceful. During the night, the enemy made a few new trenches. Friday was misty and the mist grew thicker at night. Our artillery demolished a mill which the enemy occupied as an advance post. Their guns and quick-fires being wrecked. The Germans made their usual two night attacks on the customary spot. We lost only one wounded and captured the enemy's trenches which we filled in.

Paris, Friday.

A communique states that the general situation is unchanged. The two cavalry divisions continue to operate north of Lille. A battle continues along the line Lorraine—Arna—Braz—Chaulens—Bois—Lassigny. There has been only slight fighting from the One to the Meuse.

At Woivre, an artillery duel is proceeding along the whole front. There is no change in Lorraine, Vosges and Alsace.

Paris, Saturday.

An official statement from Paris dated at eleven o'clock preceding evening says there is nothing new except sharp fighting in the Boye region, where the Allies took sixteen hundred prisoners within the last two days.

London, Saturday.

A Paris communique says that the battle continues under satisfactory conditions for the Allies. Our whole front has been maintained despite violent attacks being made by the enemy at various points. The Press Bureau publishes the story of an eye-witness from the British headquarters. Comparative calm continues. Oct. 3 to 6 the days were warm and slightly misty and a bright moon hampered night-attacks. Operations were almost confined to a slight artillery fire, though on Sunday, Oct. 5, there were three separate duels between French and German aeroplanes. Two were indecisive, but on the third the French were victorious, killing two Germans with a quick-firer. Another feature was that some French soldiers, who were coal-miners, drove a mine-gallery under a German machine-gun and blew it up.

London, Sunday.

A French communique, issued at midnight, states that only the cavalry are in contact to the south-west of Lille, but that there has been heavy fighting to the south-east and north of Arna. The enemy have made vigorous attacks on the Meuse heights.

A further communique says there has been cavalry fighting between La Bassee, Armentieres and Cassel, but it is much confined owing to the nature of the ground. We have secured real advances in many places at the north of the Oise, and so we also achieved marked progress in the region of Saint Mihiel.

The Press Bureau publishes a further narrative of an eye-witness at the British

head-quarters. It is only notable for the remark that there is a fall in the operations on our immediate front, pending a general advance. The eye-witness describes at length the country, and dwells on the German waste of ammunition. He compares the movements of the British, French and German officers.

Paris, Sunday.

A communique states that the German cavalry on our left who had crossed certain passages of the river Lys to the east of Arna, have been driven back and retired yesterday evening to the region of Armentieres. The enemy have attacked vigorously between Arna, Oise and Emme, on the right bank of the Arna, without making any progress. We have made slight progress on the centre, north of the Arna, and particularly to the north-west of Noeux. A further communique states that, between Craonne and Rheims, German night attacks have been repulsed. There is nothing to report from between Blimeux and the Meuse. The enemy attacked violently in the Aprement region and east of St. Mihiel on the night of Oct. 10. During the 10th, Armentieres was taken and retaken, and is now remains in our hands. There is no change in Lorraine and Vosges, thus everywhere we maintain our positions.

London, Monday.

It was stated officially in Paris at eleven o'clock yesterday evening that there was nothing new to report, except the capture of a flag near Lassigny.

The general impression of the operations during the day was satisfactory.

Paris, Monday.

A communique states that our divisions on our left continue in the districts of La Bassee and Hazebrouck. The enemy between Arna and the Oise attempted several attacks but failed, notably at Lassigny and Bois. We have made some progress on the centre, on the right bank of the Arna and east and south-east of Verdun.

London, Tuesday.

It was stated officially in Paris at eleven o'clock in the evening that no details were available regarding the violent attack on the front, except that we had gained ground at many points and lost ground nowhere.

A communique states that in the Vosges district the enemy made a night-attack near Saint Die, but were repulsed.

The flag taken yesterday, near Lassigny, belonged to the 4th Pomeranian regiment. There was a fierce engagement on the night of Oct. 10 when a brigade of French men killed two hundred and sixty five hundred prisoners. Our losses were only nine killed and forty wounded.

A Paris communique states that, on our left, we are progressing the offensive in the regions of Hazebrouck and Bethune, mostly against cavalry from Bailleul and La Bassee. The enemy attacked Lys which was held by British and occupied it with a German force. We made marked progress between Arna and Albert. In the centre we are progressing in the region of Berry-au-Bac, and slightly advanced towards Soissons. We have also progressed to the south of Malmeurat. Our troops hold the heights of the Marais de Verdun. We have advanced south of the road be-

tween Verdun and Metz. We have gained some ground in the region of Aprement on our right, and repulsed an attack on our left. There has been no change in the Vosges and Alsace districts. To sum up, yesterday saw real progress in various parts of the battlefield.

Correspondents at Calais state that the Germans advanced strongly in the direction of Arna. Their artillery shelled Bailleul and Hazebrouck, but were compelled to retire, and crossed the river Lys in disorder. The Germans have been expelled from positions round Lille and thrown back across the Belgian border. The train service between Calais and Lille has been resumed.

London, Wednesday.

It was officially stated in Paris at 11 o'clock last evening, that there was nothing to report, except a somewhat notable advance on our right wing.

Paris, Wednesday.

A communique states that several engagements have been fought in the neighbourhood of Ghent. Operations on the left wing, as far as the Oise, have been normal. Our progress at Berry-au-Bac is confirmed. There is no change on our right wing. A Paris communique denounces a false German report of the destruction of two French cavalry regiments. The truth is that the Germans, after several days, have only made the smallest progress between La Bassee and the canal of the Lys, and between the river and east north of the Lys. The German losses were, at least, as great as ours.

The communique adds, the German cavalry division suffered particularly, because it was pursued the whole day by our aviators, who incessantly dropped bombs. The Germans asserted that they were proceeding to invest Verdun. The truth should be plain enough, from the French communique. The Germans never came in contact with Verdun. They made two fruitless attempts, and both failed, with heavy losses to the enemy. We had not even seen one of their German battalions were annihilated. The Germans also attempted to cross the Meuse in Saint Mihiel district. Their efforts failed, they being out-flanked by us.

The Press Bureau states that the British troops have been engaged towards the left of the allied line, with the result that the Germans have been pressed back slightly on their flank. The nature of the country, which is a shifting center, makes rapid progress difficult.

It was officially stated in 11 o'clock last evening, that there was no important modification of the situation.

TERROR OF MILITARISM

LORD HALDANE'S APPEAL.

Lord Haldane, addressed two great recruiting meetings at Newcastle, and that he wished to emphasize the fact that it was his duty to call on the young men now who were being called by three great Powers. We should have been in a difficult position if we alone had been attacked. The terms of peace must assure that the militarism which perverted every talent of the German nation should be crushed and broken, so that future generations might be free from such a terror.

SIEGE OF TSING TAU.

NEUTRALS TO LEAVE.

Tokio, Wednesday. The commander of Tsing Tau has accepted the Mikado's proposal to allow neutral citizens to leave, in order to save life. It is expected they will leave shortly by the Shang Tung train.

London, Wednesday. The Press Bureau states that the Japanese Emperor has offered to renounce non-combatants and neutrals in Tsing Tau. Members of Parliament have conferred, with a view to arranging to send to Tsing Tau, with the American, a number of Chinese and German women and children.

TRAITOR'S MOVE.

BOER GENERAL REBELS.

AN ISOLATED ACT.

[REUTERS BRUSSELS' AGENT.]

Capetown, Tuesday.

A communique under Col. Maritz has rebelled in the north-west of the Cape Province, and has concluded an agreement with the Germans. Maritz claims to have German guns and German troops, and threatens to overrun the South African Union. The Government has replaced Maritz and proclaimed martial law, announcing that all rebels and traitors will be punished according to their deserts. The incident has caused the utmost indignation throughout South Africa. No measures it is felt as to its dissemination.

London, Tuesday.

A telegram received by the Secretary of State for the Colonies from the Governor, West of South Africa, begins: "Since the resignation of General Beyer as General Commandant, Orange Free, there have been indications that something was wrong with the forces in the north-west of Cape Province which were placed under the command of Lieutenant Colonel Maritz. The Government arranged to send Colonel General Brits to take over command. On Oct. 8, Colonel Brits sent a message to Maritz to come with and report to him. To this message Maritz replied most indignantly that he was not going to report to anybody; he all wanted was his discharge and Colonel Brits must come himself and take over command. Colonel Brits then sent Major Ben Bowser to take over command. On arrival at Maritz's camp, Major Bowser was taken prisoner with his men, but was subsequently released, and sent back with an ultimatum from Maritz to the Union Government to the effect that, unless the Government guaranteed, before Oct. 10 o'clock on Sunday morning, Oct. 11, that they should allow General Maritz, De Wet, Hever, Kemp and Muller, to go home where he was, in order that he might receive instructions from them, he would forthwith make an attack on Colonel Brits' forces and proceed, further, to invade the Union. Major Ben Bowser reported that Maritz was in possession of some guns, belonging to Germans, and that he held the rank of General Commanding the German Troops. He had a force of Germans under him, in addition to his own rebel commands. He arrested all those of his officers and men who were unwilling to join the Germans and had them sent them forward as prisoners to the Government."

Major Bowser saw an agreement between Maritz and the Governor of German South-West Africa, guaranteeing the independence of the Union as a Republic, including Walraf Bey and certain other portions of the Union to Germany, and undertaking that Germans would only invade the Union in the event of a declaration of Maritz. Major Bowser was shown numerous telegrams and letters, naming back to the beginning of September. Maritz boasted that he had ample food, rifles, ammunition and money from the Germans, and that he would overrun the whole of the Union. He threatened to send a message to the Government to demand that the Government is taking the most vigorous steps to stamp out the rebellion and inflict severe punishment on all rebels and traitors. A proclamation declaring Maritz Law throughout the Union, will appear in a "Gazette Extraordinary" to-day, the morning of Oct. 12th, 1914.

once more, that the strongest fortress cannot withstand the aerial might of modern artillery. Let us remember, however, that existing conditions will not continue to operate solely to the advantage of the enemy. Germany has relied upon fortified borders for her own defence. On a future day she may be sure to have in her fortifications, Germany, herself, will be brought to the realization of the lesson her own forces have taught. The science of fortification would seem to have collapsed in the face of modern machinery. But, on the other hand, the theory that a war cannot be won by big guns has not, by any means, been disproved. The strength, if not the actual superiority, of the German and Austrian artillery seems to be generally acknowledged, but it did not seem to be necessary to reach Paris, and it has failed to stop the advance of the British and Allied troops. In the field, away from fortifications, where the decisive battle must be fought, the decisive factor is the efficiency of the infantry and artillery play their part as highly important elements, but it is the infantry who must turn the scale in a great battle. This is the doctrine of the present generals. It has always been supported by experience in the field, and is being again supported by the present fighting. Cavalry can be utilized to the best advantage only when it works in cooperation with efficient battalions of foot-men. Speaking generally, cavalry and artillery cannot operate without the aid of the infantry, in certain circumstances, infantry cannot engage without the aid of the other arms. Through a campaign, it is the shooting and discipline of the infantry that the general mainly rely. We have it on the authority of Field-Marshal Frenzy that, in the present campaign, our infantry has proved itself really superior to the same German arm, and, for that reason alone, we may feel confident of ultimate victory. The Germans are not winning the war by smashing down the Belgian fortresses. Before victory is in sight they must break down the long lines of our infantry, and this cannot be done with big guns; it must be done by men possessing the same qualities as their adversaries. The strategic importance of the fall of Antwerp we do not attempt to explain, but we cannot believe that it will greatly affect the progress of the Allies. 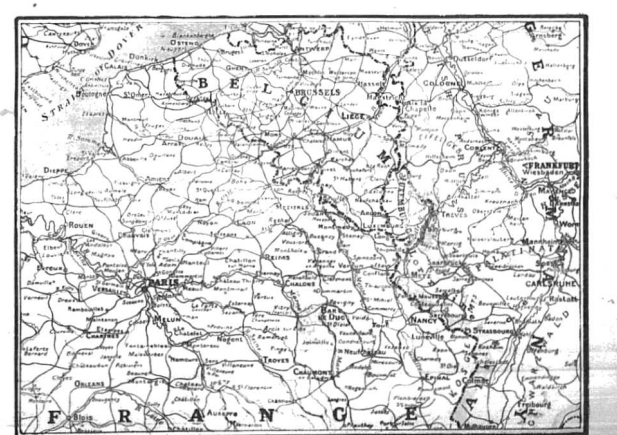

Consequently, we contradicted the rumors, and Mr. Mackay's issue, which had contradicted on many other rumors, we were not kept in touch to a large extent, with the outside world. Some light would now seem to be shed upon the somewhat unaccountable conversation between the "Konigsberg" and the enemy's territory, which, from time to time, has been reported by press. 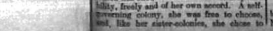

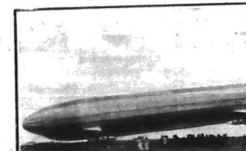

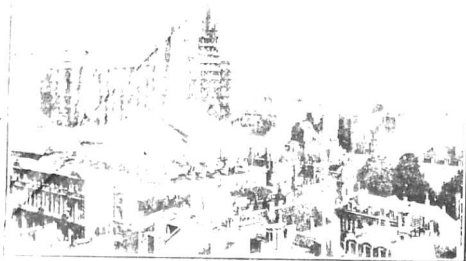

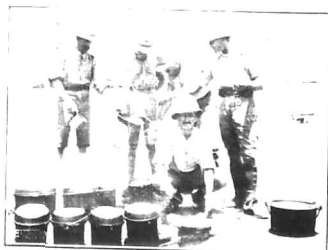

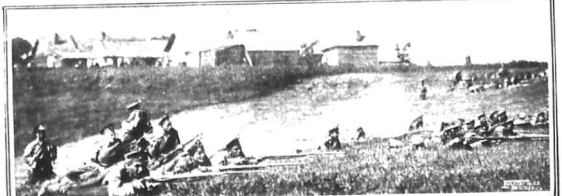

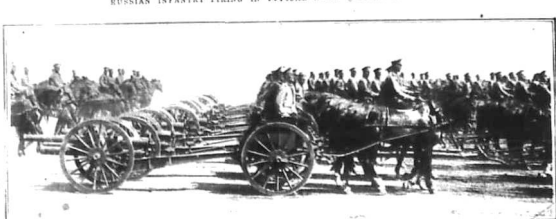

Our London Letter

From Our Own Correspondent.

London, Sept. 25.

At this stage it is possible to see that conditions have already been secured which if they cannot be localised, can be pointed out as complete and absolute ones. All industries concerned with sugar or the manufacture of preserves have been long since since the war, and the proprietors of such businesses can see themselves getting ready to run every day. It is impossible to say what is the ideal it is pointed out that in the marketing of condiments, jams and preserves, considerably over two hundred thousand people are employed in this country. All these people live on industrial wages and consequently reduced money or, at least, a few shillings per week per person (many of the workers in those trades are women and girls) and consequently the average of wages is low. This means that wages completely lost, money which might have been recovered, amounts to over £10,000,000 per week, a dead loss in the spending power of the nation which is a reflection for all those with whom those wages would ordinarily have been spent.

The buying class have either had their buying power curtailed or are recipient in part of the war in such a fashion that they have neither time nor inclination to spend. This has resulted in a serious loss of productive wages entirely, and those not only wages but factors in the production of manufacture of feminine fashions, as some people appear to think, and the upholsterers, carpet makers, makers of those useful articles which are so much suffering and factors in other trades. The wages of the various trades which are the furniture trade alone must be over £10,000,000 per week, but when we come to the textile trade, again allowing for the fact that the textile trade is not a single business and Government supplies, we get an appalling total—over £100,000,000 of wages being normally paid every week. Four shillings per week, a loss of about £100,000,000 per week. In the mining world, apart from South Wales and one or two favoured North country pits which produce so coal, values are almost as bad, and having in mind the fact that mines are far more than cotton workers and that there are more of them, it is probable that the loss in wages in the coal world just now is over £200,000,000 per week. These instances of complete losses, but of course are confined to the home market, and in the export and against them must be set the fact that engineering—that part relating to the provision of any Government work—shipbuilding and the carrying on of general works of construction are going on merrily. Indeed the London building trade is very busy just now and even dock labouring is doing better times than when last President Wilson was in the position of the shipping which is being done in London.
