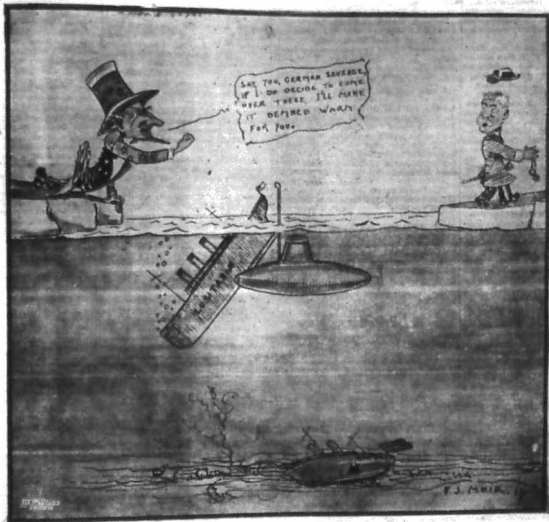

JURY'S VERDICT: "WILFUL AND WHOLESOME MURDER."

[VENOCHUS BRYANT'S ABSTRACT.]

London, May 7.

The Lusitania has been torpedoed. According to a Queenstown message, the steamer was torpedoed by a German submarine off the Old Head of Kinsale. Assistance has been sent.

The Cunard line have issued an official statement to the effect that the Lusitania was sunk in the afternoon at 2.33. There is no word as to the fate of the passengers or crew, who total 1,900.

The passengers included: 390 first-class; 662 second-class; 201, third-class; while the crew numbered 665.

The admiral at Queenstown immediately sent assistance to the Lusitania, despatching four destroyers, five trawlers, a tug and a collier. It is known that the liner had struck the mine.

The Lusitania was seen to be in distress at 2.12. She completely disappeared at 2.33.

The Cunard Co. have great hopes that many lives have been saved. A submarine sank in the Irish Sea, without warning, the Liverpool steamer *Candidate*. One boat was swamped, but all the ship's company were saved, although the submarine rendered no assistance.

London, May 8.

The Admiralty states that survivors from the "Lusitania" are being landed at Queenstown, the wounded being sent to hospital at Kinsale.

Between 500 and 600 survivors have been landed at Kinsale.

The Admiralty's correspondent states that the "Lusitania" was sunk without warning. A number of her boats are making for the coast.

Maritime who, it will be remembered, created a record a few years ago amongst the Atlantic "greyhounds" by her trans-Atlantic passage.

Though precise figures are so far unavailable it is now certain that less than six hundred have been saved from the "Lusitania." It is reported that the millionaire, A. Vanderbilt, is drowned. Among the other prominent people aboard were Charles Frohman the impresario, J. Foster Stockhouse the explorer, Herbert Stone, son of Melville Stone, the manager of the Associated Press of New York, D. A. Thomas, a Welsh coal-owner. Survivors state that many passengers were killed or injured by the torpedo.

The Press Bureau reports that altogether 658 survivors of the "Lusitania" and 45 bodies were landed out of a total of 2,100. It is unofficially reported that 22 died at Queenstown after landing. Most of the officers perished except Captain Turner.

Some of the passengers on deck saw the submarine, some half mile away, fire two torpedoes. There were pathetic scenes at the Cunard offices when the relations and friends realised that 1,502 were dead or missing.

France is overcome with anger at such a colossal murder. The neutral countries are horrified at the outrage and say it will cost Germany dear.

At Washington the opinion in official circles, to-day, is that the policy is extremely grave.

The Admiralty says that the newspaper reports that the "Lusitania" was armed wholly false.

Another 45 survivors have arrived at Queenstown, making the total 1,457. The gravest fears are felt of the death of the distinguished American, Vanderbilt and Pearson the two millionaires, Furness and Hubbell, authors, Charles Frohman the

Cowper, a Toronto journalist, interviewed at Queenstown, says that a sharp look-out was kept when approaching Ireland. He was chatting with a friend at about 2 o'clock when he caught a glimpse of the conning tower of a submarine a thousand yards distant. He remarked on the circumstance to his friend, then they saw the track of a torpedo. The "Lusitania" was struck forward with a loud explosion. Portions of the splintered hull fell into the air. Shortly afterwards another torpedo struck the "Lusitania" and she began to list on the starboard side. The crew immediately proceeded to get the passengers in the boats.

Everything was orderly. A six year old girl appeared to Cowper to save her. He put her in a boat and heard later that her parents were lost. Cowper got into the last boat. Some of the boats could not be launched owing to the list and had to be put away as the vessel was sinking. There were many women in the second class and about forty children under a year old.

The "Lautbach" was a merchant ship of 4,000 tons, bound for London. It was torpedoed on May 11, 1915, in the Atlantic Ocean. The ship was carrying a large quantity of war supplies for the United States.

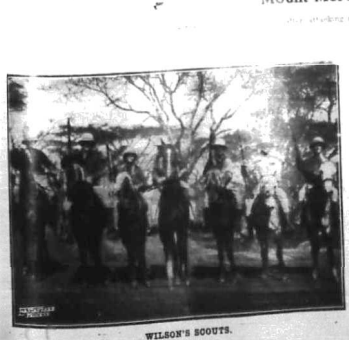

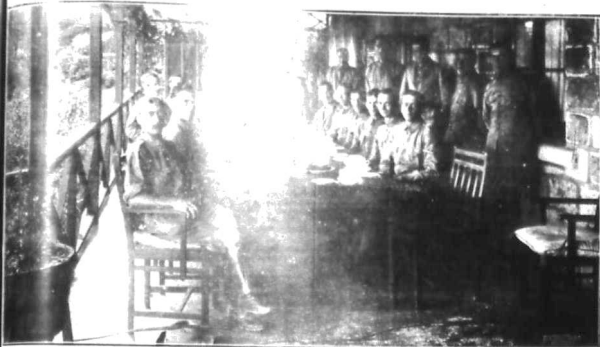

PRINCELY GENEROSITY.

MAHARAJA'S MAGNIFICENT GIFTS.

Situated amidst what is probably some of the finest scenery in East Africa, stands the beautiful Maharaja's Hospital at Gwalior, which forms one of the finest recuperating stations in the world, and, during the past year, our vast and weary contingents have found a haven of rest, the accompanying physical, the country-side had secured a glorious green expanse so closely associated with our views; but for the few native huts dotted here and there over the landscape, the scenery was absolutely English.

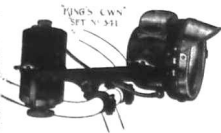

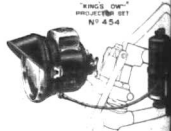
