GENERAL ARTILLERY ACTIVITY.

Enemy Leave 8,000 Dead.

CAPTURES OF MEN AND GUNS.

(SPECIALIST'S AGENT.)

London, October 8.

A Paris message says that a costly counter-attack continues at Arras, in Champagne, and in the region of Tracy-le-Val, in the Ardennes and on the heights of the Meuse. There has also been some lively fighting in communication trenches to the east of Tabora Hill.

A communique issued in Paris says that the Germans to-day, after an intense bombardment, attempted a violent attack on Loos, and in approach from the north to the south. These were completely repulsed with heavy losses. We made fresh appreciable progress in Champagne, and in the south-east of Tabora, and also gained a footing on the work-styled the "trapezoid." We captured several trenches and two forts, which were included in the salient held by the enemy on the front of his second line. We captured over two hundred prisoners, a great mortar and some machine guns. There were artillery actions in the western Ardennes, the Prete Wood and the Vosges.

London, October 9.

A Paris communique reports that the German losses in the attack of Loos were very heavy. The assault was delivered in three successive heavy waves followed by one in column formations. All were stopped down by the combined fire of our infantry, machine-guns and artillery. Only a few machine-guns were captured. Our only captured machine-gun was in one of our recently captured trenches between Loos and the Leno-Bethune Road. Other violent and repeated attacks on the south-east of our village and Vaas were repulsed. Our recent progress everywhere is maintained. Our artillery nipped in the bud, with a certain fire, a German night counter-attack east of the Narain farm. The south-east of our village was repulsed. The south-east of Tabora has been a violent bombardment of asphyxiating shells.

Several strong reconnoitering parties in Loosville attempted to attack French outposts in the forest of Parry. They were completely repulsed except at one point from which the stormers were only partially ejected.

London, October 10.

A Paris communique states that this morning, renewed attacks on our trenches in front of Loos were driven back to the German trenches. A violent artillery duel occurred this afternoon on the whole of the front. We completely repulsed a counter-attack in Champagne, against Thiers Hill, and delayed a gallant German attack on the front of the Meuse. Bomb troops preparing for a final assault against our trench were repulsed. We captured a trench from the Argonne. We captured a trench from the enemy in Loosville.

London, October 10.

Field-Marshal Sir John French announced on October 9 that the repeated attacks by the enemy on our new trenches have been repulsed, and our trenches are being steadily pushed forward. To the north-east of Loos we gained ground varying from 200 yards to 1,000 yards in depth, while a great enemy attack delivered yesterday was repulsed. We sent another German trench, and our losses were comparatively slight.

A Paris communique records the fact that the same artillery activity continues, especially on the crests of the Meuse, and in the south near the east of the Meuse. A message from Paris states that the German artillery only maintained a pitch of far intensity, and the French batteries replied everywhere very effectively.

A communique adds that fresh reports confirm the violent counter-attacks which have been delivered by the Germans during the last few days against the British and French fronts before Loos and to the north. These only resulted in a complete and costly defeat. The principal assault was carried out by three to four German divisions. These were completely repulsed and dispersed. The number of enemy dead in front of the Allied lines is estimated at anything from 7,000 to 8,000.

London, October 12.

A further Paris communique states that we have very appreciably progressed in the wood to the west of Souchez, towards the Greve Valley and to the east of the Giverny Wood. We also gained ground on the crests towards La Fosse, where 100 guardhouses were captured. We made fresh progress in Champagne and to the north-east of Tabora, and captured, by a vigorous attack, the whole of the German work to the south-east of the German salient of La Goutte Ravine. The total number of prisoners captured here amounted to 108. Our guns effectively countered the German guns which were violently bombarding our new positions. Furious machine-gun artillery duels have taken place at Lespagnas, the Prete Wood, to the north of Vailion, in Loosville, in the Vosges, to the north of Lorraine, and on the outskirts of Thann.

A Paris communique states that the enemy in the afternoon bombarded in the most violent fashion the trenches we captured yesterday to the north-east of Soissons when we took 104 prisoners. The intense artillery duel also took place in the Soissons and Champagne fronts. Our progress continues in Champagne towards the Loosville.

The German infantry, however, was only able to gain a footing upon 60 yards of our front trench, but a serious counter-attack enabled us to re-occupy a portion of this immediately.

French aeroplane squadrons are most active in their attacks upon German railways in the Oise region, where troop movements have been reported.

A Paris telegram says that heavy fighting and cannonading has occurred along the whole front. A communique states that the Germans in a night infantry attack to the north-east of Soissons were everywhere completely repulsed, as were preceding attacks. Between the Soissons and Oise, and along the Aisne particularly violent bombardments have taken place. German batteries delivered a violent cannonade in the region to the south of Tabora, and to the east of Hottel-de-Monai. The French guns replied effectively, while the French infantry are advancing from trench to trench to the east of the "works known as the "trapezoid."

London, October 14.

A Paris communique says that the enemy in strong forces renewed their attacks to the north-east of Soissons, and at five other points, including the Giverny Wood, but, despite the extreme violence of the artillery preparation and the dispersion of the reported assaults the enemy was only able to penetrate some sections of the trenches in the Giverny Wood, and these had been completely wrecked by heavy shells. Everywhere else we retained our positions, and repulsed the Germans, whose losses were most heavy.

Particularly violent artillery actions have occurred to the south of the Soissons, in Champagne, on the outskirts of the Argonne, and between the Meuse and the Moselle.

ITALIAN FRONT.
