Situation Reviewed.

END NOT FAR DISTANT.

Nairobi, October 10.

The following official communiques have been received:

The student in German East Africa towards the end of September was as follows:

On the coast, the Portuguese have crossed the border and are a few miles into the interior. The British force is observing them with small parties.

Our troops occupy Mikindani, Kilwa, and Zanzibar. The British force is not yet able to catch up at these places but various

guerrilla detachments were being collected and the enemy was at Mombasa, and had advanced. Observation posts on the sea front of the coast were held by the British Central Railway and the north country of it was in our hands, with the exception of a few posts which were held by the Germans near Mombasa and Schenkenz.

On the mainland, our forces took Dar es Salaam, and our main force with General Van Lennep were southward, distributed along the coast, and the British force was at Mombasa.
