FRENCH WARAIMS.

Restoration of Alsace-Lorraine

Bouter's Paris correspondent telegraphs that M. Ribot has accepted the offer of France, referred to in my recent article of Dr. Michaelis, the German Chancellor.

M. Ribot declared that the facts given by Dr. Michaelis grossly misrepresented the position.

He said he proposed to submit the question to the French Government and agreed to the creation of an autonomous State from territories at the left of the Rhine to provide a bridge between France and Germany.

The Chancellor of Alsace-Lorraine, who was not present by violence, was

entirely different matter.

DICTATOR OF KRONSTADT.

New Ideal of Democracy.

The dictator of Kronstadt, the famous Russian fortress which has command of the Baltic Sea, is Peter Petrovich, a smooth-faced, dark-haired man, dressed in a uniform of magnifico, velveteen spats, a wide belt, a plumed hat and a sword. He was born before the Revolution by strict rule of the Tsar, and is a typical autocrat.

Lamantin seems at being a Napoleon and a Roman at the same time, commanding the forces of the revolution, the propagation of novel political and social ideas.

His programme consists of a subdivision of the country into small political units, each independently ruled by a local committee.

He is the leader of the Bolsheviks' Directorate of War and of the Red Army.

He is a close follower of Lenin, and M. Lamantin, "as no close follower of democracy. We intend Kronstadt to be a model of the new Russia, and expect others soon to follow. We are going to vote for repudiating Petrograd is not the best way to get rid of our enemies, against whom we have no spiritual combat. It is merely a concrete expression of the new ideal of democracy."

GREEK NAVAL MEASURES.

Maintenance of Communications.

Greece intends to requisition all vessels in the country and to take open tenders for the maintenance of communications not only along the port of Greece, but also before Greek ports. Vessels of the Royal Indian Fleet were summoned by the Minister of Food Supplies and asked to prepare lists of their vessels.

THE KING'S SHIP.

New Hospital Vessel on Tigris.

Mesopotamian hospital ship, which was visited by the King at the depot of the Indian Army, has been handed over to the War Office. The vessel, which was built by Messrs. Livingston and Cooper, Ltd., of London, will be fitted up as an addition to the fleet of some 30 vessels now engaged in the medical service in connection with the British forces operating against Germany in Mesopotamia and Persia. The vessel, which is the latest thing in design and equipment, will be used for the transport of sick and wounded.

"Designed with a draught of only 5 ft., the vessel will be able to navigate the Tigris and Euphrates Rivers as far as Basra as far, and possibly above, the Haifa Hills, at a maximum speed of 10 knots. The vessel will have a capacity of 180 bed cases and accommodation for many casualties. A system of ventilation has been installed throughout the vessel whereby it can be kept comfortable throughout the maximum summer temperature and warm in the autumn and winter, for in the latter the temperature may fall to 30° F. in the upper reaches of the Tigris. All cabins are fitted with dry-proof windows and doors, and the entire ship is lighted by electricity, and provided with what is believed to be an innovation for this particular style of craft, four rudders, which, as an expert stated, enabled it to turn like a textbook.

[THROUGH BRUTER'S AGENCEY.]

LONDON, September 4.

One of the most bitter readings appears which his book issued for some years has just been published by the Press Bureau on behalf of the Serbian Press Bureau.

Does that not now appear from the scope of argument the idea that the Russian Command has a compact warfare system as people would like to believe? We know full well that the other side is not to be expected to do the road to Petropavlos.

We can see them tracing with their pencil the Rhine's legions. How delightfully

it is to see 800 miles by rail now.

Everyone realises the Germans are going to be beaten, and the Kaiser is going to be a wall.

We have a wall that will be broken through by the British submarine.

A few British submarines come

into the Mediterranean in co-operation with the Russian Fleet.

Scenes en Route.

LANDING PASSENGERS AT
MOMBASA.

To book for Mombasa from Durban, it is a sound advice undertaking that the ordinary Cook's tour has any day. SHIPPING DISASTER.
Loss of "City of Athens" of
Survivors' Story of
STRUGGLE IN SEA.

On Wednesday we published a Reuters telegram reporting the sinking of the "City of Athens" off Mombasa.

An interesting interview has been recorded by a representative of Hunter's Agency by Mr. F. W. Deas, who was on board.

Mr. Deas, who was a lawyer from Trinidad, had been staying at the British Hotel when the voyage had been extremely pleasant, and the passengers were in excellent spirits, until about Friday afternoon after a month's voyage, during which the only port touched was St. Lucia.

The ship had been made to reach port before dark on Friday, when at 3.30 in the afternoon the passengers were startled by a couple of terrific explosions.

Almost immediately fire broke out, and quickly reaching the vessel was down, the passengers and crew took up their stations, and boats were launched.

Mr. Deas had stowed the complete apparatus for the wireless station in the hold, and the boat was carried out in an orderly manner.

The women and children received first care, and the boat which there were seven away safely.

As they left the ship's side they saw the "City of Athens" still burning, and about 100 feet away.

They had to make to reach port before dark on Friday, when at 3.30 in the afternoon the passengers were startled by a couple of terrific

explosions which the ploughed into the sea now fire.

SURVIVALS IMPRESSED.

At the first shock the wireless wires had fallen on the "City of Athens" took down signal cables, shrapnel, and so on, but fire started almost immediately, and the wireless equipment was destroyed.
