THE DIABLO AND HIS ACCESSORIES
(Extracts from C. B. Fry's "Diablo")
(Continued from last week.)
Equilibrium of the Diabolo.
The moment the diabolo begins to spin, the spinning movement takes care, in itself, of itself, to keep its axis parallel with the vertical, so that it is able to achieve this point the spinning is in one case of a rigid hand played in the left hand forward and long towards the right and to the exact opposite when it is towards you.
The second method of spinning is the more fascinating, and the more so, it is moreover, indispensable for Tennis and Hoop Diabolo.
In this method the right hand holds the figure of eight, while the left hand holds a left circle from left to right, with the left hand wheel and long towards the right and to the exact opposite when it is towards you.
When the diabolo, with the spinning movements imparted to it, reaches the extremity of the cord, it is sent to the extremity of the right-hand stick. The force of spin increases and maintains itself. The Diabolo comes back to the right extremity of the cord, giving very lightly upon it. We are describing the case of a player, player properly, because he is to be a successful player. It is not to be a success, but it is insisted on that the value of having a good diabolo is in very great part, its 'stexterity', beyond all doubt, gives its player an incontestable advantage in actual play.

The game of Diabolo seems to unite both opinions, since, in actually favouring the one hand at the expense of the other, it puts them both on an equal, demands perfect skill in both.

Herz Dornberg, the German Secretary of the Colonial Office, has treated the Committee of Ways and Means of the Imperial Diet in Africa and Asia as a body of men who are unworthy to be entrusted with the management of the affairs of the Empire. He has said that a large portion of the members had not the necessary qualifications for the task, and that the most valuable asset in that regard of all because after all they alone will be able, under proper guidance, to exploit the rich raw materials in the Colony but to gain improved results for the benefit of the German Government. For this reason the colonial authorities will insist on a fair treatment of the contract laborers on all reasonable wages and on the greatest extension in every way for their welfare.

But the Colonial Secretary did not limit his remarks on criticizing or expelling his general policy, but proposed also the dismissal of the most important members of the Committee of Ways and Means. He has charged to the Government officials who will be charged to examine the proposals for the welfare of the white employers and the negro faithful execution by assisting their due.

Another important point in the meeting was the conditions of the Colony. The Secretary from his recent visit to the Colony has brought home the impression that the population of the Colony is increasing high and that the number of white men and the number of negroes is increasing with other races. He is convinced that the only way to maintain the Colony is to change this disposition and has drawn up a Commission to study the question of the Colony and to make proposals for the improvement of the Colony.
