**EARLY COAST FEARS.**  
 Among the numerous inquiries in the Protectorate that give promise of developing into proper national surveys, the earliest industry, anyone travelling through the country cannot fail to be impressed with the extraordinary facilities of cashing on a colonial bank, and yet progress is being retarded by a series of obstacles, in the shape of rules, regulations, and restrictions, which, if not removed, will fail to achieve their purpose. The manager of East Coast Bank, Lower Kenya, has written to the Veterinary Department and has advised that the Veterinary Department is confronted with a difficult task in checking the spread of the disease, but at the same time we submit that what is required is a bold and liberal policy. This is also a question which has been discussed by the members of the Executive Committee, and it is to be hoped that the question will be introduced at all acts of our Legislature from time to time instead of getting at the root of the trouble. The unfortunate part of the present system is that the restrictions imposed on movements of cattle to and from a farm is frequently neglected through the fault of the owner. It is, therefore, a matter of some importance of combating the spread of the disease, and that is by universal dipping, and that is by the use of a Contagious Dipping Ordinance, similar to that in operation in South Africa, Rhodesia and elsewhere. East Coast Bank is not prepared to take to the East African Protectorate, but the methods of dipping it appear to be and there seems to be no difficulty in carrying out a dipping system which has proved efficacious in other parts of the African continent should be adopted here. The best method of dipping to control the disease by the use of salts and regulations is, in our mind, a matter on which we will be very happy to advise, and we hope to see the same old remedy, namely, dipping, carried out in the future. #### DOUBLE INCOME TAX.

Colonies Owing to Natural Resources in Good Position.

LONDON, June 7.

In the House of Commons Mr. Bonar Law in the course of his comments on double income tax said that the way is going to have a financial burden which would not be met by the colonies and that had to be considered was how each part of the Empire was to bear its own burden, and having regard to the immense natural resources of the Dominions he thought they would be better able to bear their share than the Mother Country would be able to bear hers.

In the House of Commons whilst in committee on the Finance Bill Mr. Bonar Law replying to the amendments regarding the double income tax said that the present position should not be maintained a single day after the war but could not be dealt with at present. He said that frequently the amount received by investors in Dominion stock was higher despite the double tax than obtained from investments in the United Kingdom. He undertook that this matter should be discussed by the Dominion Prime Ministers at the approaching conference.

With regard to the road repair now in progress in Government Road and Sixth Avenue, we understand that the work was given out to contract by the P.W.D., and is not being done departmentally.
