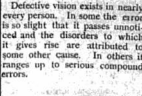

OUR SACRIFICES
Effect of these Days at Home
A VISIT TO LENS

(These are our communications)
LONDON. Sept. 12. These are great times. For over four years the nation has toiled for them and at last we are seeing the fruits. It is quite a different feeling from that experienced by an army which embarking upon a campaign. It is a feeling of deep satisfaction that there is at last, a very concrete firm, something to show for the appalling sacrifices we have made since 1914. This is no figure of speech; it is a fact. It is a fact which is a much enough fact.

I do not say so much as I mean the personal privation of the community because a family 95% have felt no privation at all worth mentioning and only 5% with small fixed incomes and no power of making their voices heard by way of protest have really suffered, though they have suffered badly.

The sacrifices, apart from the dead, are in the wounded, whose numbers though not for the moment exceptional, seem to be more and more noticed owing to the discharge from the service of one-legged, one-armed, and half-battered men. Increasingly our notices in all buildings and offices the presence of stunted ex-soldiers, for whom one is glad to say, employment is being found.

I have often spoken with British officers and men who have served next to the Americans on the Western front, and without exception they say that no praise is too high for the military prowess of these Trans-Atlantic Crusaders, as President Wilson truly calls them. This tribute should be remembered in days to come.

It is no use trying to revive any week's fighting when the newspapers on any day fail to keep track of what is happening. How can they? There are half a dozen armies operating in a variety of ways at different points, with perfectly marvelous precision to which the German Generals try to cover up details, and only pay tribute. As a result the Western Front is always in a fluid condition and no one can say from hour to hour what may happen.

The troops return from the front state in colloquial language that they have "Jery on the run," that for some reason being the business, nowadays applied to the Hun. These returning men are not the wounded for it is symptomatic of the strength of the British Army that even now, during the great push, we are able to give general leave to 50,000 soldiers a week.

One man was actually in the fighting line advancing against an enemy position, when his sergeant touched him on the shoulder, and said "You're to leave." The man was so thunderstruck that he told me he took to his heels and ran back like a hare for about a mile, for fear they might find that after all he had made a mistake.

Another fell last November, when on Vimy Ridge, watching our advance artillery in the very suburbs of Lens, whence we were shelling the Germans some two to three miles away. The officer in charge, added by an aeroplane which was spotting for him, was endeavouring to hit the tower of a church eight miles away, because it was set by the enemy for observation purposes.

Now then Lens was little more than a shell-hole, the inhabitants were dead, and although the winding gear at the head of the famous coalmines was still in place, it was clearly so irreparably damaged that it will be twelve months before these conditions are again in working order. They will not restore relief the same feel shortage this winter.

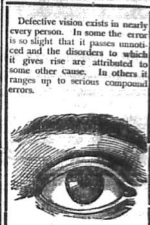

BATTLE OF MEUSE.

LONDON, Nov. 9.—An American communiqué says we wrested from the enemy his hold on the heights eastward of the Meuse and drove him back into the lowlands of the Woëvre on a front of 14 Kilometers. We advanced a depth of six kilometers taking Les Evrins, Dailly, Favières, Darnville, Fléghes and many other towns and villages. We captured six heavy guns and many machine-guns and rifles and many prisoners. Our aviation bombed and machine-gunned enemy concentrations in the region of Baden and Remelville and blew up an ammunition dump at Gihery. We shot down four balloons and three aeroplanes.

DARDANELLES PASSED

LONDON, Nov. 9.—Our Fleet Commands Constantinople. Reuter learns that the Allied fleets will anchor off St. Sophia at Constantinople on Saturday November 9. The Germans have transferred the "Goeben" to the Turks, and the Gibraltar will be interned in a Turkish port.

BLUFF TO AUSTRIA

LONDON, Nov. 9.—Reuter's correspondents at Amsterdam quote a message from Vienna to the effect that German troops have crossed the Austrian frontier into Tirol and Salzburg. A Rome dispatch states that the Italian occupied Trieste, Zara and Lussino.

PEACE DELEGATES

Germans Interview Marshal Foch

ALLIES' ULTIMATUM

(THROUGH REUTER'S AGENCY.) LONDON, Nov. 7.

A wire from Paris says that the German Peace delegates are expected to pass the French outposts at 8 and 10 o'clock on Thursday evening.

Reuter's Paris correspondent says a German wireless message announced that in order to permit the passage of German delegates orders were given to cease fire on the front from three o'clock on the afternoon of Thursday.

LONDON, Nov. 8.

A wireless German official message states that a German delegation for the conclusion of an armistice consists of Erzberger, Count Osendorff (formerly ambassador to Sofia, and General von Guentard and Von Winterfeldt.

The Press Bureau announces that owing to the heavy German barrage and machine-gun fire on the battlefield, the passage of the German front from Marshal Foch's Headquarters to Spa was so delayed that he is not expected to reach the German Headquarters till the afternoon of November 9, and it is unlikely that any decision will regard the armistice will be reached to-day.

Reuter's correspondent at Amsterdam states that the French wireless message cabod earlier was a reply to a Berlin wireless announcing the conclusion of German peace delegation and stating that it would be accompanied by secretaries and interpreters and subordinate persons who would arrive in motor cars at a place to be designated, adding that the German government would be glad if with arrival of the delegation at the front of the Allies a provisional cessation of fighting could take place.

A wireless French official announcement that the plenipotentiaries received the conditions for an armistice and were given until Monday at 11 o'clock in the morning to accept or refuse them. General Foch rejected the proposal for a provisional suspension of hostilities.

Foch Says No.

A wireless German official statement says that Erzberger on behalf of the German plenipotentiaries sent a message to the Imperial Chancery which has been given to the high military and naval commands as follows: "At the Allied General Headquarters on Friday morning the plenipotentiaries received the conditions for an armistice, as well as a formal demand that they be accepted or refused within 72 hours expiring at 11 o'clock on Monday morning. The German proposal for the immediate conclusion of a provisional suspension of hostilities was rejected by Marshal Foch.

A German courier bearing the text of the conditions for the armistice has been sent to Spa, other means of communication being impracticable. Please acknowledge receipt and send back the courier as soon as possible with your latest instructions. Sending fresh delegates is unnecessary at present. At official message from Berlin says the States Secretary of the Food Dept. issued a proclamation promising the early alleviation of the present food shortages and announces that peace and the raising of the blockade are now close at hand.

Many inquiries have been received by the Blockade Ministries and Research Committee for bearings, palm leaf bags, now made by the natives, and their manufacture may be organized and extended.

DYNASTY THROWN OUT

(THROUGH REUTER'S AGENCY.) LONDON, Nov. 8.

Reuter's Berlin correspondent says that a Munich meeting in the Day Building on November 8, decried the deposition of the Wittelsbach Dynasty.

In Amsterdam says a Munich message reports that Soldiers, Workers and Peasants Council formed in Munich has issued a proclamation announcing that henceforth Bavaria will be a free state and a people's government is being formed immediately. Meanwhile the Council has constituted itself the Diet.

The proclamation adds: "The democratic socialist republic of Bavaria has the strength to realize a peace for Germany which shall preserve the country from the street. A constituent National Assembly elected by all adults will if possible be convened. A new time is being made for Bavaria which will mark the dawn for the League of Nations. Revolution was necessary in order at the last moment to prefer for a people's self-government without too terrible shocks before the enemy armies march across our country, before the troops after an armistice could be sent. The Council promises to suppress all excesses and maintain order and safeguard personal property. Soldiers in barracks will govern themselves by means of soldiers councils. Officers who do not resist will be allowed to carry on. All officials will remain at their posts. Fundamental social and political reforms are commencing immediately."

NEW AGE METHODS

Triumph of the National Kitchens

(From Our London Correspondent.)

At home, every day sees new Socialist experiments. The establishment of National Kitchens is one of them, and it is a great success, since the results are near. Long Hill Station makes £100 profit a week, and gives a meal which no private table can equal, although from a competitive standpoint the Government does not seem to have any advantage in respect of purchase of trading facilities. These national kitchens may in the coming year when fuel is short play a big role.

Mr. Lloyd George has at any rate nothing to worry about so long as he can intercept and stop in their early stages any incipient Labour trouble. All over the Civil Service, too, there is a certain amount of dissatisfaction, owing to poor wages, but this is not confined to Great Britain. The Minister, however, who can successfully end the war is bound to have the public on his back. This is why, whatever happens, I think Mr. Lloyd George will hold his own, and as on the peace issue he has a very strong line he is certain to be supported by the nation.

DOMINIONS VOICE

To be Heard in Final Peace Terms.

CABINET PROMISE

(THROUGH REUTER'S AGENCY.) LONDON, Nov. 8.

The Press Bureau says that the statement made by Mr. Hughes that the peace terms had been definitely settled at a recent conference at Versailles without consulting the Dominions renders necessary a statement of the actual position on this question.

The British Government has always recognized that the magnificent efforts and sacrifices made by the Dominions and India entitled them to an equal voice with the United Kingdom in the settlement of terms of peace. The whole question of a general peace settlement was exhaustively discussed by the Imperial War Cabinet last year, in which Australia for domestic reasons was not represented. The conclusions were communicated to Australia and were again reviewed by the Imperial War Cabinet this year in which Australia's representatives participated.

THE CONFERENCE.

The British representatives at the recent Supreme War Council have done nothing inconsistent with these general conclusions, nor has an effort been made to discuss the peace terms of any specific objects to them, which the attention of the Imperial War Cabinet was drawn by the representatives of the Dominions and India soon probed or prejudiced.

The British Government has every intention of consulting the Governments of the Dominions and India with itself as early as possible in future discussions of terms of peace. The Governments of the Dominions and India have been warned to hold themselves in readiness to come over or send representatives with a view to remaining in constant and close touch with developments, and being represented at the inter-Allied conference to be convened shortly in order to consider in detail the practical application of the general principles of a peace settlement.

OUR LOST FRUIT

Why 1,500 Cases for B.E.A. Were Held Up.

It is common knowledge (says the "B. & S. A. Export Gazette") that the Imperial Government has placed every conceivable obstacle in the way of the export of tin-plates to S. Africa ever since the outbreak of war and other pressing public undertakings, and that perhaps in the explanation of the allegations that firms on the other side are now demanding £44 and £15 a box for plates which was a considerable time ago cut there.

The material result is that various industries may be compelled to close down. One Cape firm, for example, has had to buy 7,500 cases of tin fruit for British S. Africa, but the tin plate cannot now be obtained, with the result that the firm threatens to stop production.

This is only one instance out of many which might be cited. South Africa is now making large tin, although not in large quantities, and the great demand is for the article from overseas.

With regard to Spain's cabinet troubles it is officially announced that the movement at Coimbra has been suppressed. The majority of the officers and soldiers of the 25th Infantry, including Colonel Moura, who had taken the revolt, have fled and are awaiting.

OUR TEA FROM CHINA

DEMAND FOR CHINA TEA.

Points of Interest to B.E.A.

QUAINT MIDDLING

(FROM OUR LONDON CORRESPONDENTS.) The tea question is still attracting a great deal of attention and "the Grocer," which is the organ of the tea trade publishes the following article:

According to reports, a small quantity of China tea has recently arrived. A fleet of six or seven vessels, almost of antiquated type, in the trade at the present and are being chartered to take tea from India and Ceylon with the present "hot" season. It is quite another matter to attempt a large business transaction with India and Ceylon. The fully of entrusting business of this nature to a Government agent was obvious to everyone except the tea zones most directly concerned. The inevitable happened. The consequence was that a total of some 5,000 half chests is that all that has matured from his mighty effort during the past ten months, and we doubt very much whether there will be a similar quantity for the next six months or more. The misbelief, however, has been done, and already there is a demand in the market for China tea on account of the publication of the fact of the arrival of this "pieg."

THE DISTRIBUTION. The Director of Tea Supplies is now faced with another problem. Only a small proportion of the 5,000 half chests consists of Hoiing, the balance being Lap-sung. It will be clear it will be at 2s. 6d. (which we know will not pay the freight), or will be packed in 2-oz. packets in order to keep to the registered ratios.

And, if so to which section of the public will it be allocated? Will it be sold to the public as an Indian and Ceylon tea by the Control Commission, and grown of printed and typed matter issued to wholesale and grocers as to how and where the 10-oz supply is to be obtained? Will those firms who have made a special study of China tea be left with the right to their proportion, or will it be sold to the

A letter emanating from the Director of Tea Supplies in the early part of this year stated that, to ensure all tea being sold on the statutory price, and in order that all consignees who asked for China tea might obtain it, it had been decided that the Government importation of tea, commonly used to be blended and packed in packets with an official Government label, and distributed in the trade in that manner.

The distribution of the trade was to be on a pro rata basis according to the Hainan Island share of each firm. What is to happen now that the Dublin Port is closed?

The grocer of this country has a much on his mind as to how to get the tea to fill up forms as to how possible requirements of his firm, seeing that the supply small quantity that has been purchased, and the improbability of any further supplies for months ahead and again we suggest that Mr. Cline is to see to it that the tea has been in a hot, ready supply or left alone.

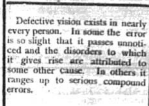
