Inspector Calder Punished for Hasty Action.
 LONDON, Sept. 12.
 The Standard understands that District Inspector Calder, of the British Guiana Police, who recently made a seizure of bullocks in Venezuelan territory, has been removed from his present post.
 The Governor has informed the Legislature that Captain Calder, who recently crossed the Venezuelan frontier and seized a quantity of bullocks which was alleged to have been brought in British Guiana, violated the frontier to the extent of 200 yards. The bullocks has been returned to its owner and regret expressed to President Castro.

Fastest War Vessel.

GERMANY'S 33-Knot Turbine Torpedo-Boat.
 HAMBURG, Sept. 18.
 The German Torpedo-Boat G. 137, which has attained a speed of 33 1/2 knots, is declared to be the fastest war vessel afloat.

This turbine-boat is the result of extensive experiments extending over months, conducted by the Germania Shipbuilding Company of Kiel. Hitherto the fastest German torpedo-boat has done only twenty-seven knots.

The Freedom of the Colonies.

LONDON, Sept. 9.
 Lord Eglon, the Colonial Secretary, who was the guest of the members of the Corona Club at their eighth annual dinner at the Hotel Cecil, London, announced the role of the old woman who lived in a shoe (says the London Daily Express).
 In giving the toast of "The Club," he stated he was glad to find himself among those representing the Crown Colonies. "Of late," he said, "I have had a good deal to do with our sisters, the Crown Colonies."
 "They are like young ladies 'coming out,' regarding in their newly-acquired freedom, and having neither desire that to repudiate all connection with the schoolroom, and especially with the old governors. I fancy also that there is some idea of a change of air."

"I venture to think that a prudent mother in these circumstances" will not be too restrictive. She will seek carefully to see what use is made of this newly found freedom, and with regard to the schoolroom and the governors, I think it might be convenient to have a sitting room."

"We have found or hope to find, a new sitting room," he continued, "and we hope that while our sisters will find a welcome in the sitting-room the old governors will not be dismissed."
 "I regret that there should be any disposition to change the name. Somehow I attach great reverence to the name of the Colonies. It is a historic name, and I am sorry that there should be a disposition to change it to Dominions."
 "But it is a question for the Colonies themselves," he declared in conclusion. "I have no objection to the change so long as there is no inferiority presupposed as regards the Crown Colonies."



A Cunard Captain's Skill.

NEW YORK, Sept. 10.
 For his "humanity and skill" in rescuing a French sailor from death in the Atlantic, Captain R. C. Watt, of the Cunard steamship Carmania, has received a gold medal from the Life-saving Benevolent Association of New York.

On the morning of June 10 the Carmania sighted a small party with one man in it. Captain Watt maneuvered the large turbine vessel in a rough sea so to place her alongside the little boat, and one of the men then jumped into it and put a rope about the helpless sailor who was taken aboard the liner.
 Under careful treatment the man, who was badly injured, and related that he, Louis Vollet, and his mates, fishermen of St. Malo, had been swept out of the story in a big wave on May 27. He swam back to the boat but the others were drowned. The provisions lasted for six days, after which Vollet suffered terribly.

Record non-stop Train Run.

LONDON, Sept. 18.
 The Great Western Railway Company established another record long non-stop run, when the Irish boat express covered the 26 1/2 miles from Paddington to Poignard Harbour in the 56 min. The average speed was 130 1/2 miles per hour, and the weight of the train, which carried 200 passengers, was 150 tons.

Previously the longest non-stop run was on the same company's line from Paddington to Plymouth—a distance of 226 1/2 miles—in 47 min. there, the average speed being 54 1/2 miles per hour.

An Intolerable Situation.

The Great Wryley Outrages.

LONDON, Sept. 6.
 The recurrence of the stock-raiding outrages at Great Wryley, says the "Evening Standard" will be led to create a situation in that neighbourhood which must be put a stop to by any means within the law. Wholely apart from the bearing of these fresh crimes on the innocence of Great Wryley, it is an intolerable state of affairs in any civilized community that allowable outrages of this kind should continue to be perpetrated over a lengthy series of years in defiance of all the efforts of the police. Few persons, we imagine, and least of all owners of live stock in the neighbourhood of Great Wryley, will be particularly reassured by the statement of Mr. Glasdon that the police are doing all in their power to apprehend the criminal or criminals. The same answer would have been given by the police or their official representatives at any time since the crimes first began; and the result of their endeavours has been nothing, or worse than nothing. It is high time that the resources of the local constabulary were reinforced, if only by drafts from other districts sufficient to patrol the country with more effectiveness than is possible to the present existing village police.

ALIMENTARY HYGIENE.

Recommending Aliments and Condiments.

Food passes qualities which are not rarely nutritive. There are in fact aliments which are termed "nervin" or "stimulating" foods, and which give the illusion of real stimulation by causing an excitation which is the main time food and power to the nervous and the digestive action, generally by the activity acquired from nutrition.

These aliments are distinguished by the fact that with their employment the stimulation is not lasting and does not exhaust the individual. The activity which they produce is maintained by the contribution of energy which they make to the organism, so that the latter, under the effects of the stimulating aliment, is not actually "replenished" or "restored."

Food "is endowed" with a greater "active" power than any other aliment. The main effect shows itself a rather long period before complete absorption; the bonds begin to be felt with the first mouthfuls of food, before hunger is satisfied, much before food has entered the intestine.

Recommending aliments produce a similar result, but, if in any particular case these aliments, possessing in themselves no material element of energy, can only derive energy at another source, the organism is not benefited in the organism. Yet these aliments possess another action, which is employed with an aliment which is insufficient in every respect, they permit of the undertaking of a labor which would not be possible and which is usually more fatiguing than any other aliment.

Certain substances are used in medicine, and which are in the nature of "nervin" foods. Ether, hydrochloric acid, sodium chloride, alcohol, are employed with a view of stimulating the organism. They place the organism momentarily in a state of "excitation" which allows it to react against the physical fatigue by working more regularly at the disposal of the reserves. But no one can be sustained with ether or alcohol and the medicinal substances are not to be employed as a stimulant and can be replaced by a rational aliment which it is desired to retain the benefits of.

The economic aliments may be added to the list of "nervin" products as they seem to be qualified in appearance. They act only in a local, indirect manner on the general system, by favoring the transformation of the aliments which do not undergo in order to become assimilable. They may be employed in the case of children, and of the elderly, and of those who are suffering from nervousness and people suffering from weakness, by assisting the consumption of food which is not so easily digested.

Some of the substances of a "pungent" or "stimulating" nature, such as ginger, pepper, cayenne, should be taken only with precaution. They exercise a harmful action on the stomach and the kidneys, above all when the quantity of these organs with the advance of age is not satisfactory. Children support these substances better, but there is no case of stimulating their digestive secretions.

Certain spices act, above all, on the stomach and bowels, such as cloves, cinnamon, vanilla, saffron, etc. Some have also an action on the nervous system, such as cayenne, ginger, and saffron. They are not to be employed in the case of children, and of the elderly, and of those who are suffering from nervousness and people suffering from weakness, by assisting the consumption of food which is not so easily digested.

WORLD'S NEWS BY CABLE

[Reuter's East African Service.]

The Threatening Railway Strike.
The Two Chief Societies Join Hands.

October 18.—Mr. Ball addressing a Meeting of Railwaymen in London state that if the Railway Companies persisted in refusing to discuss the "huller" question on an equal majority in favor of a strike. The meeting resolved that the only course open for the men was to strike.

October 19.—A prominent Railway Director has accepted an invitation from Mr. Lloyd George to discuss the present Railway crisis. Mr. Lloyd George will then have meetings with other Directors, and Mr. Ball will be invited to see him afterwards.

October 21.—The British Railway Companies are organizing in view of an emergency.
October 21.—An important stage in the Italy fight was reached on Saturday night when a Conference at Manchester of the Railway Workers Unions, representing 160,000 men applied to join their forces in supporting the "Amalgamated Society of Railway Servants" claim. This recognition and decision ends the breach between the Amalgamated Society and the Engineers and Drivers Association.

H. E. M. Hesketh Bell's Promotion.

October 19.—It is announced officially that the Officer administering the Uganda Province has been promoted to the rank of Major.

The Threatened Strike in Italy Collapses.

October 18.—The Italian Government intend presenting the Railwaymen at Turin who lately joined the general strike, the violating the recent law.

October 19.—The Rome State Railway Administration has decided to dismiss and degrade the strikers and to grant bonuses to the strikers.

October 23.—The Italian Railwaymen have decided not to strike finding that public opinion is unfavorable to their cause.

October 18.—The Hague Conference have adopted 20 votes to 12 the Minor amendments from voting the British Resolution recommending the Powers to adopt a Permanent Arbitration Convention.

October 19.—On the 17th the Hague Conference voted the final Act which was signed yesterday. The following resolutions were adopted: Three Declarations and five Resolutions.

October 21.—At the closing sitting of the Hague Conference President Casarion stated that the International Prize Courts arranged for was a monument to the conference. He warmly replied the suggestion that they had done nothing for the maintenance of peace and said that useful foundations had been laid whereon their successors may build.
