#### MEDICAL OPINIONS

"On the other hand, there appears to be the strongest argument in favour of the Government recommending the married official. The married man is a more reliable man, and his falling out in the bush in present circumstances could only be considered a national disaster. From the point of view of the medical officer, it is generally desirable that officials in tropical Africa should be married and that their wives should accompany them to East Africa whenever possible; and again, it has been maintained with every sound reason that a man is better cared for if he is married and his wife can look after his children in his absence."

"According to the opinion of the Principal Medical Officers in the B.E.A. Protectorate, white women should be allowed to settle in Africa as well as men, even if their children will usually have to be sent home at an early age, so that the Government would not appear to be neglecting an important possibility from the point of view of health conditions, in encouraging its officials to marry and bring their wives."

"In this connection I received an interesting memorandum from the Bishop of Zanzibar, who, writing from the 'native' point of view, emphasizes the advantages of marriage for Government officials. After dealing in some detail with this aspect of the question, the Bishop sums up as follows:—

"It seems to be obvious that the Home Authorities must make it possible for officials to marry early in their careers. If a man arrives in the tropics knowing that in two years or so he can at least enter on an engagement to a wife, he is actually married, he has a powerful motive behind him to work hard, and he will, if he can, to lead a decent life. But if he knows that he can never marry unless in the dim future there shall be an epidemic among officials and some luck working on his behalf, he is really virtuous to tropical mores."

#### PREFERENTIAL TREATMENT

"I have thought it desirable to refer to this question, as it is a matter of considerable importance. Preferential treatment has been accorded throughout to the married official, and a higher rate of bonus is given to the married official. It is to be noted that the cost of living has been drawn at a higher figure for married than for unmarried officials."

"In the case of many approved, I am in agreement with this principle and I have myself adopted it. But I consider that when the question of raising salaries on a permanent basis is taken up, there should be no differentiation of this nature, but that the salaries should be such as would enable a man to marry within six or four years of his appointment to the Service, and maintain his wife and children in reasonable comfort."

But it should not be forgotten that the married official may, and not infrequently does, have to support dependants other than his wife and children; and I feel satisfied that the balance of argument is in favour of giving to the married official a wage bonus that is in excess of the unmarried."

"Dealing with the cost of living the report says:—

"On January 10 of this year the report of Sir Robert Hamilton's Commission is stated that the cost of necessary foodstuffs imported from Devonshire has gone up by between 80 per cent and 100 per cent; that the locally produced articles used in some respects go up less but are not procurable or are only procurable in small quantities; that household necessities, clothing and boots, have gone up about 100 per cent; and that reliable evidence shows that the increased cost of basic living expenses, apart from rent or clothing, in spite of close economy, may be put at about 60 per cent."

#### RAISING PRICES

"Since that report was written, prices have for the most part risen higher, and as regards imported goods, the rising value of the rupee in India will ultimately have to be borne by the consumer. So, that this charge increases the cost of all goods carried on the Railway for officials of the East African and Uganda Protectorates."

"Finally, the effect of the war has been to reduce the purchasing power of the rupee. Even before the war a rupee in East Africa was not the equivalent of 1s. 6d. in England, so far as purchasing power was concerned, and the effect of the war has been to reduce it to about 1s. 3d. in England."

"This is still the case, except that it is now more than doubtful whether the purchasing value of the rupee in East Africa is equivalent even to 1s. 3d. in England. And I would argue that this point should not be overlooked in connection with the general review of salaries, which are reckoned in pounds sterling."

"In addition to the actual cost of foodstuffs there has been an increase in the wages of other services, which are now required. Like other sections of the community a man has to pay more for their food; and the fact that there has been a large demand for personal servants among the military officers serving in the East African campaign has doubtless limited the supply and so raised its price."

"If anything, these figures are below the average wages for East Africa in Zanzibar and the East African Protectorate, especially the cook's wage, and there are many housewives who, if they buy their own food, will receive Rs. 25 to Rs. 30 a month."

#### HOUSE RENTS

"There has been a general rise in house rents throughout East Africa. Officials occupying Government quarters are not affected by this; but the rents of the European officials are a very large number of non-European officials who have to find their own accommodation."

"In Nairobi where £40 (the usual house allowance for a 2nd Class European Official) would have been sufficient in pre-war times to provide an official with accommodation, £200, which is the non-European equivalent, would have to be paid for their own housing out of their salaries, not to mention the considerable expenditure on food and other necessities for the maintenance of the family."

"In Zanzibar Rs. 30 to Rs. 35

used to be an average monthly rent for three rooms; now an Indian clerk will pay for the same rooms (Rs. 40 to Rs. 70) in Nairobi, or (Nairobi a single room will now cost Rs. 30, and Rs. 45 will be charged for a room and kitchen, although by sharing a house and having two men in each room, the monthly cost for lodging may be much reduced, and in one house which I inspected the average cost to such lodger worked out at about Rs. 15 a month for two men."

"There is one other point which bears indirectly on the amount of bonus to be granted to Government officials, viz., the investment of monies of colonial firms, and other non-Government institutions in respect to, to be bonus."

#### PRIVATE FIRMS

"Three instances may be cited:—

(a) Eastern Telegraph Company. General increase of salaries by 50 per cent, with maximum bonus of 250%.

(b) National Bank of India. General increase of salaries by about 25 per cent in addition to the bonus.

(c) Smith Brothers and Co. No fixed scale of bonus, but salaries improved generally and new agreements drawn up on terms most favourable to the employees than before. The General increase for employees who were in the Company's service prior to war broke the ten-year pay of about 33 1/3 per cent."

"From these instances it will be seen that banks and commercial firms have taken into account the increased cost of living, etc., in East Africa is such that they must increase very considerably the emoluments of their staffs."

"After careful consideration, I submit the following recommendations:—

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- That war bonus should be granted on a higher scale than that existing in any of the three Protectorates, viz., as shown in the Appendix to this report.
- That the scale of bonus should be the same for all three Protectorates.
- That the bonus shall be paid with retrospective effect from the 1st January, 1917, to all employees.
- That there should be no limitation of salaries above that for the European officials, or the non-European officials.
- That women should receive the same bonus as unmarried male officials.
- That the bonus should be paid to all officials while on leave, subject to the restrictions approved in the Appendix to this report.
- That a sum of Rs. 25 per annum should be granted to non-married non-European officials who are not provided with quarters, and Rs. 45 to married non-European officials who are in the same position and who are not provided with quarters. Where an allowance is given in lieu of quarters, this should be raised accordingly, but it should be left to the discretion of the Protectorate Administration to reduce the bonus to any part of the above.
- That some assistance should be given in the payment of wages and children's maintenance, but the present be granted to the non-European officials, and that of the non-European officials should be proceeding on leave, with retrospective effect.

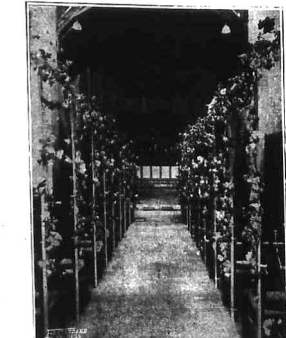

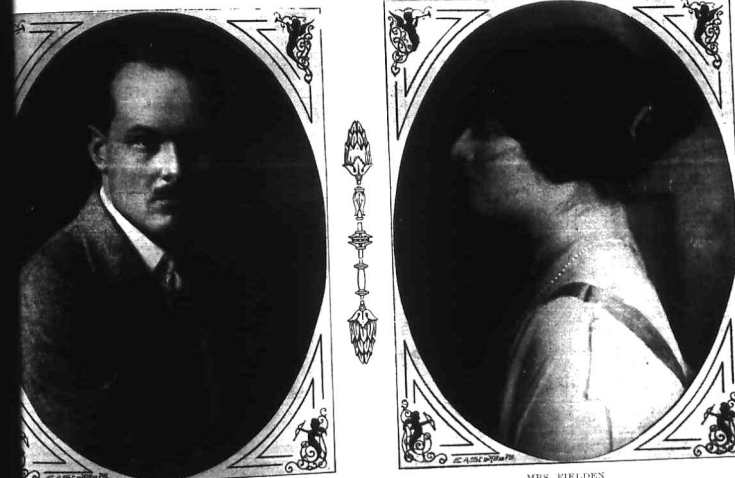

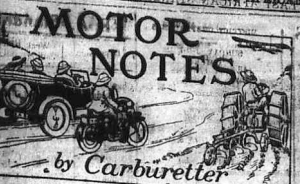
