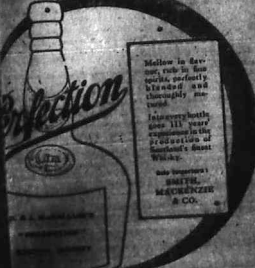

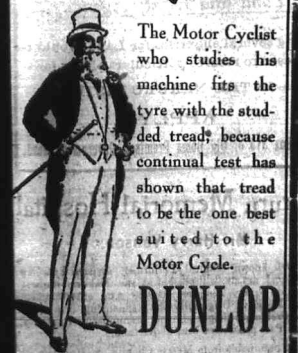

### TOWN PLANNING BILL

(From Our Own Correspondent.)

There was an interesting debate as to the Legislative Council on Monday evening, when Mr. A. A. Morrison moved as follows: "That in view of the rapid extension of congested areas in the congested native areas in Mombasa, His Excellency is requested to instruct the Government to enquire into and report as early as possible their recommendations with regard to the building regulations which should apply to that area and what roads and open spaces should be provided in that area, and what practical steps should be taken to carry their recommendations into effect."

Speaking in his motion, Mr. Morrison said Mombasa as the first port of call, was a very small area of stone buildings situated between the Ondonga and the Forest, very limited in extent, highly insanitary, with no proper roads or means of communication through it. It had been given up as practically hopeless. At the same time there was a very large area covered by huts roofed with makuti thatched. These, of course, were very close together and the people who lived in such houses would know they were most suitable and the most hygienic form of building. It was possible to live in the tropics. Makuti huts always had an admirable ventilation, and were very cool, due to the breeze from the top.

**BAD BUILDINGS.** Unfortunately, during the last few years, the makuti roof area was gradually superseded by buildings of a more permanent structure, with stone walls and corrugated iron roofs; very small windows, and some of two storeys. The iron roofs did not admit of ventilation, and such buildings were very costly to erect. These buildings were being removed on old sites of makuti huts themselves. There was no plan passed upon which these areas should be created.

The Member for Mombasa, proceeding next, as His Excellency had stated there had been a Town Planning Commission for Mombasa, but he dealt with a very much smaller problem, namely the general layout of the island, perhaps very necessary in itself but apart from the general problem. The congested area had not been dealt with under this scheme. He would like to see if His Excellency would favour the President and appoint a commission of experts who would be sent down and report in a short time on the actual growth of the native areas and select the open spaces which should be reserved for the future.

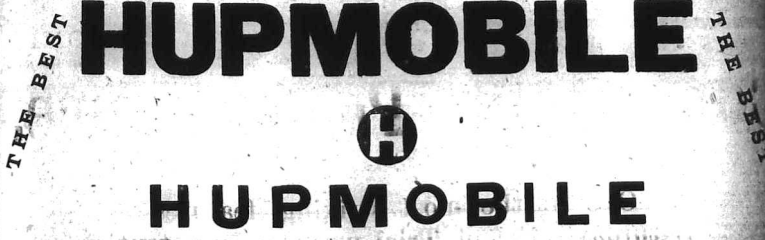

Members, August 22. The Mombasa Electric Light and Power Company are publishing a notice to inform that their works will cease operation on September 15, due to the expiry of the concession.

**PEACE CELEBRATIONS BY ALL COMMUNITIES.**

The Kismu peace celebrations were held on July 19 and were in the most participated in the victory festival. In evening a parade of police under Capt. Smith, Superintendent of Police, led a few dozens of the band of the Indian Jack on the double on the top of the Bazaar Hall, and the drum three times were for the King led by Mr. Waddington, O.R.E., Acting District Commissioner, Kismu, the senior representative of the British Government present at the time.

Mr. Waddington hastened back to the Provincial Commissioner's residence, followed by large crowds of all communities, in order to be present at the reception, which was held at 11 a.m. Of course, no room or room could accommodate all people, and some had to stand up in the street and others on the roof. Mr. Waddington, Acting District Commissioner, delivered a speech on the occasion. Mr. Imam Bahak, Sub-Act. Surgeon, spoke on behalf of all communities and laid special stress on the solidarity and devotion of Great Britain for the freedom of mankind.

The National Anthem was sung by all present, and thereafter three choirs were given for the King, the Queen, and the Empire. The assembly then dispersed. In the afternoon, Mr. Waddington attended an Arab noon outside the town notwithstanding the rain. Later the subordinate officials enjoyed a tea party, to which they were invited by Mr. Waddington. Mr. Imam Bahak, in a few well chosen words, thanked the host for remembering and honoring them all on such a delightful occasion. Mr. Waddington, in return, expressed his pleasure for having their company at his house. Tea over, it was the time for the Small Regatta, to which Mr. Waddington hastened. On his arrival he was welcomed by the cheering hoards of spectators over his head and resting them on his hip.

**RED CROSS BENEFIT.**  
At night, a dinner was given by Mr. Waddington to all his fellow officers, civil as well as military.

The small Green community, in order to show their loyalty to the British Crown, erected a pavilion with an arch, bearing appropriate mottoes. This was nicely decorated, and at night brilliantly illuminated. Here Green community invited a great number of persons of various communities, who were served with tea and biscuits. In the evening, Mr. Waddington, with his fellow officers, were entertained by the Green community right royally at their pavilion. The first toast was for the King and the Queen, which was enthusiastically listened to the Kismu Orchestra, which was much applauded. On July 21 the Khoja community the following day, and his fellow officers attended the Bazaar, where speeches were delivered, followed by cheeriness. There was sharp bidding for a Ra 10 note presented by Mr. Imam Bahak for the Red Cross, and the note was declared good for Ra 200 to Lieut. McCartney, Officer Commanding Military Troop, Corps, who kindly gave it over to another officer, who in turn for Ra 200 to Mr. Gabriel's, who also kindly gave it over to another officer again for the last time, and it went for Ra 200 to Alibhai Agha. It was then declared by Mr. Waddington that Ra 600 had been realized for the Red Cross Society. The proceedings terminated with the singing of the British National Anthem.

B. E. A. BAD STEERING

The Editor, K. A. Standard.

Sir—So much has been written about the exchange that I'm afraid you will be getting tired of reading the different schemes set forth to bring things to normal again. It is because we are a Protectionist and so cannot so to money markets of the world without permission of the Mother country, that we are as we are. I'm told the exchange is going up to 60 per cent, and that it will be more and more before it comes down again; how very interesting. Some of the get rich quick who live in the emporium of the fillers of the soil, must be laughing up their sleeves, when they think of the rich harvest they are reaping over the double ocean. They are indeed greener than the public. And the Protectionists naturally are not too keen to see the exchange down, not likely, indeed it means 20 per cent advance on any money they like to transfer to England, and having their new Co-operative Stores they are excited on velvet.

At a quick glance the only path to-day, are the ones selling their produce in London, or the ones existing to sell land. There has been no slump in land, not is there likely to be, but the market is at a stand still for the time being, or one has to accept payment over the water or on long terms. So it comes down to this: the corner of land wishing to sell and the producers who sell on the London market are the sufferers. But this is not really the case.

The whole country is suffering through much capital that would have come here being invested elsewhere, which is keeping the country in the narrow rut it is in to-day. One is inclined to wonder if we are really and truly a part of the Great British Empire or one of the Balkan states.

Some years ago there was a great clamouring for self Government. All this seems to be an echo of the past, but really Mr. Fisher now bestirring themselves don't you think it's a bit late we began to sit up and take notice. This sort of thing cannot go on, and we are shortly going to see thousands if not thousands of new settlers coming to this country, thinking I have no doubt they are going out to one of England's progressive colonies. We are geographically enough in a way, but this Protectionist is not like any other colony. To have a small feature to get there. The new settler will settle down alright, but how long will he be able to sell up. But look what has to face: the disabilities of this country have been seen. That I will not go into here. He will hold no real title to the land he is buying, and will the bulk of B. E. A. advance him cash against his holding? I very much doubt it. He must be a creditor country, but I'm sure, etc. We want

to see the incoming settler make a success and we have to go to the man in the street and borrow money at a rate of interest no farm can stand.

There are so many different opinions of how much, a man requires to start successfully in this country that it's hard to know which is the correct figure, so much depends on the man. But of one thing I'm absolutely confident, no land settlement scheme should be put forward without a Government Land Bank is started at the same time. I know the old survey is coming to this statement and oh it does make me so tired, I'm sure the cash! By jove, must have some pretty bright men handling the finance of this country, if they cannot start a Land Bank right away. What about the deferred Loan. Why not consider a Land Bank. I'm sure the Banking Institutions of B. E. A. would welcome a Government Land Bank for it would handle a class of business which the existing banks do not care for, namely long loans and I feel bound to say it's the least the Government can do. Why they hold the majority of the assets of the country for a long term of years, then let them open a land bank and make advances for long terms, and give the settler a real chance of getting on his feet.

The great countries which properly have a great future, but they were really in the water, not B. E. A. is unlike Australia, Canada, or South Africa. If we ever come up against it, in any of the other countries he can for a few or a longer get right back, or if he does not want to go, can get a job of work right where he is here, where will he be? I have the answer to you.

Surely this Government can obtain permission to issue East African Bonds or something on the same lines as the present loan in England, if they do not care to go right out for a Premium Bond. You need not go out of Africa for all the money B. E. A. wants for the time being. After all it does not take much figuring to work out what this country could borrow on its revenue, which I think is something like one million about the same. Why the rail has been and the worst of the country gets into debt for 10 or 12 millions sterling, while the revenue is only a few hundred. We have an object lesson here, what Dick Seddon did for New Zealand and I don't if you will think of a more prosperous country in the world to-day, but of course I nearly forget they had self Government and were able to do things. What I really want to know is this: Even as a Protectionist, are you or are you not a part of the British Empire? But what a silly question to ask of a country which would be quite sufficient to make us to borrow in the outside market and not real money to work this wonderful country with. I don't think we should have a Dual Currency would do the trick, for I'm sure we are all getting
