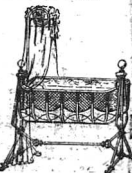

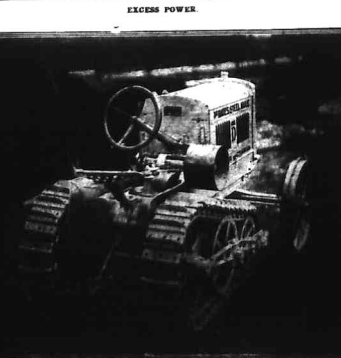

THE BATES STEEL MULE. SOFT AND MUDDY SOILS NO TERRIBLE TO THIS TRACTOR.

The flexibility of the Bates Steel Mule is well illustrated on the preceding page. An important feature of this tractor is its ability to turn in a very short radius owing to the fact that the operator can use not only the front wheels but making them, but also the independent connecting links which are placed on each side of the tractor. 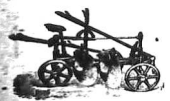

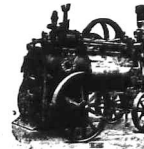

Naturally, certain conditions were placed upon the respective employer, although it was carefully impressed upon him that no undertaking would be demanded from the native. Those conditions did not seem onerous, although the terms of the contract for Port Hall Bona, was somewhat inconvenient for the great majority of the districts to be affected.
FAIR CONDITIONS.
 It was distinctly understood that, though no period of employment could be granted, we might be of use to the native, being out of work during the following six months—no necessarily on one farm for the whole time—that their pay would be Rs. 6 and board, and a delivery to a European representative at Port Hall he would have to be responsible for their food to the place of employment, the cost to be charged up to the employer.
 Numerous applications were taken at the meeting which, with other subsequently received, totalled six. The main difficulty was to find a member to make the safari to Port Hall and back on behalf of the applicant, as it was expected that each agent would be responsible for the personal delivery of the natives to individual applicants.

QUIBUS REPUAT.
 In order to obviate this difficulty, a deputi was sent to the C.N.C. on June 21 to ask him if it would be possible either for delivery to be made at Thika, or if this was possible, whether the agent might have to cover the fees at Port Hall and to re-appear appointed by the respective applicants (By this means it would have been possible for the agent to have made the journey by motor and returned the same day.) The C.N.C. definitely refused the former concession, and tentatively the latter, but agreed to visit the D.C. Port Hall for his opinion on the latter and suggested we should do so. (Since the withdrawal of our applications, the natives set on about, the former concession, we understand, has been granted, despite the positive denial given to us by the D.C. Port Hall and notwithstanding the fact that the D.C. Port Hall had been told that we were to re-apply until July 9 when a telegram was received that "delimitation has been taken by a European" and no answer to the question was then asked. A list of applicants and their numbers was handed to the C.N.C. by the deputi and forwarded to him by the D.C. Port Hall. Nevertheless we were subsequently contacted by letter and were sent to read lists of the numbers required.)

TALKS OF SUFFLE.
