The system has certainly stood the test of time, and though numerous amendments have been effected since the original scheme was introduced over 80 years ago, the principle still holds good. So far as we are aware, there are no insuperable difficulties in the way of the application of the system in British East Africa, which, we believe will be generally welcomed. It will not mean extra work for the Government Department concerned, but rather the reverse, as the whole business of land transfer will be immensely simplified incidentally, the legal conveyance will disappear, as it will be possible to put through a transfer without calling in the aid of a solicitor, and therefore with the minimum of expense. Naturally, local conditions will need to be borne in mind in applying the system here, but the whole subject is of such importance that we feel sure that the introduction of the legislation mentioned by His Excellency will be keenly awaited.

**STANDARD NOTES**

The Legislative Council have adjourned until April 7th.

Mr. A. G. Higgins has been appointed Secretary to the Priority Committee, in place of Mr. H. Lane.

Mr. J. T. R. Nettidge, Lumbea, is appointed Permanent Lecturer under the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, vice Mr. H. Watts.

The mails which went out on January 17 and February 1 arrived in England on March 8 and March 13 respectively.

The American Consul has several inquiries with regard to the tin in beans, and would be pleased to receive samples and information as to quantities available, etc.

The adjourned meeting of the Soldiers' Education was held in the Theatre Royal, Nairobi, last evening, when one of the principal matters of discussion was the Government's speech.

The steamer "Khalifa" is expected to leave Mombasa for Lamu on March 22, in the afternoon, and the auction sale of ivory will take place at Lamu on March 23.

The Compagnie des Messageries Maritimes, notify us that their steamer leaving Marseilles since February 30 are no longer under Government's regulation. The French Government, however, still

leave 200,000 passengers per month, and two-thirds of the freight space. A steamer left Marseilles for Madagascar, Mombasa and Zanzibar, on March 8, and will be followed by one every 28 days.

A social evening will be held at the Young Women's Christian Association Hotel, Kirk Rd., on Wednesday, March 26, at 8-15 p.m. All members are cordially invited.

It is stated that a tremendous rush of visitors to Europe from America has begun, and that one shipping company alone has booked already 200,000 passengers for next year.

The Magadi Railway line, a quarter-mile strip of land on either side of it, and all land within a quarter-mile of the lake, are exempted from the order closing the Masai reserve.

It is officially notified that the King's exequatur empowering Mr. Stillman W. Ellis to act as Consul of the United States of America at Nairobi, received the royal signature on the 30th of November last.

Any qualified persons may now apply for a license to the Governor-in-Council to manufacture, possess, or sell blasting powder. The magistrature of applicants' district will report to the Governor before the license is granted.

Messrs. H. Wardle and Co. have a new preparation called "Ceregen," which is an excellent tonic for the nervous system and for improving the quality of the blood. Anyone feeling fed-up or run-down should give it a trial.

A "Gazette" notice fixes the maximum price of Halwa rice at 18 cents per lb. at Mombasa and 24 cents at Nairobi. Milford rice shall be 19 cents, and 25 cents, respectively. White Java and Mauritius sugar shall be 30 cents and 37 cents.

Spearmen's trophies excepted, export duties from B.E.A. have been fixed: buffalo hides 80 cents per lb., other hides 60 to 80 cents, goat skins 1 lb. each, hippo teeth 1/2 1/2 per lb., and rhino horns 1/2 1/2 per lb.

Nairobi Defence Force is disbanded, and all arms and equipment are ordered to be handed in to the Ordnance Depot on the 24th and 25th inst. between 4 and 5.30 p.m. No longer will the popular chorus raise the roof in Parklands Sports Club.

A cable was received from the National Council, Y.M.C.A., London, on March 19, giving authority to engage Captain Watson, C.F., as General Secretary. Capt. Watson is at present in South Africa, but is expected to return in about three months time.

An interesting item in the P.W.D. expenditure passed by the Legislative Council is 8750 for the training of African artisans. It has been found that the native is peculiarly adaptable as artisan and mechanic, and the P.W.D. is likely to train them in fast increasing numbers.

On and after April 1 next local postal charges will be increased to 10 cents for each half ounce (or fraction of it). A clearance fee of 50 cents will be levied on every postal parcel coming into B.E.A. and liable to customs duty. These charges affect inland letters, those to the C.K.; British possessions generally, and Egypt.

The Hon. J. W. Barth, as Chairman of the Education Commission, has replied to a letter from the Government, asking whether the Commission would undertake evidence by the Goans for the effect of the education of their children. Mr. Barth says the Commission will be ready to hear the Goans at the next sitting in Nairobi, and accordingly the Institute will send three representatives, viz. Messrs. **ALLIES HURRY UP**  
**Germany Going Over to Bolshivism**

**NO INTERFERENCE SPEECH AT**  
 London, March 6.  
 In the House of Commons to-day, replying to the debate on foreign affairs, Mr. Bonar Law said few people now had any illusions as regards Bolshivism. The Allies were agreed that something must be done for Russia, but not to recommend despatching the necessary forces to quell anarchy. He could not therefore add anything to the speech of the Premier on the subject.

The Government realized that the country expected to get the least possible indemnities from Germany. He emphasized, that it was our business to get every penny we could, but it was useless looking out the hope that indemnities would wipe out the country's immense war debt. He agreed it was unpractical to get peace concluded quickly, because there was a real danger of Germany sinking into Bolshivism. Moreover there was the greatest necessity to get our own trade and industry restarted as early as possible. Therefore, the sooner the blockade was ended with the knowledge that we could depend upon another season, the better it would be for Britain and the world.

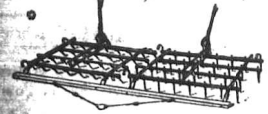

Alleviation of Local Cases of Distress

To THE EDITOR, E.A. STANDARD.  
Sir,—I think the two letters which you have published signed by Mr. Donnelly are calculated to give the impression that those responsible for the proper distribution of the above Fund are finding difficulty in finding an outlet for the balance in the manner originally intended, viz for the alleviation locally of pecuniary suffering due to the war.

Should such an impression have gained ground, I think it should be, officially contradicted as early as possible, and some attempt made to get into touch with the persons entitled to relief.

In my own small circle of friends I know of several cases, and I would cite one in particular, that of a widow whose husband, a staunch supporter of, and contributor to the Fund from its inception, first had his hand blown off and later died of "blackwater" fever on active service. This lady had to provide for and educate three children, but on applying for some assistance from the Fund, was told it would be necessary to wait until after the war, when the calls on the Fund would be known. This she quite understood, but the generous offer to hand over the balance to a Memorial Fund has caused some uneasiness in her mind, and no doubt also in the minds of others similarly situated.

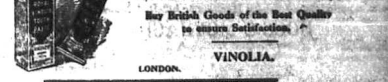

From Our Own Correspondent. London, Jan 17. I have already indicated the problem which is being made in the allocation of war trophies to various parts of the British Empire. I have now received the following official letter:-

Dear Sir:- I have been trying to find a solution to the problem of the allocation of war trophies to the Colonies, and I should have answered your letter of 17th December earlier. I now find that an application on behalf of the territories you are alluded to has been made to the War Office.

The number of trophies to be allocated to particular territories must be for the decision of His Army Council after consideration of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales' list of the several Colonies and Protectorates.

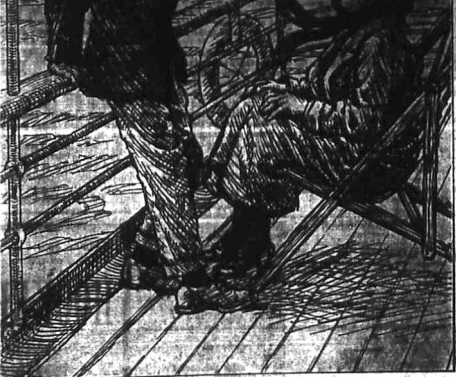

R.E.A. in Soldier Settlement

BRAINS AND GRIT PREPARED  
GOVERNMENT AND STATE BANK  
WITH THE SETTLER

An Australian, who recently returned to his native land after having been wounded while serving in France, has forwarded for our information the following interesting particulars with reference to what the Australian Government is doing to settle ex-soldiers on the land. In the course of his letter he says:—

"The Australian Soldier Settlement Act is a measure which enables a discharged soldier with very small capital to make a start, and under the provisions of the Act he also receives financial assistance.

There are no less than five securities by which a soldier may take up land. They are as follows:—  
1. Homestead farm, Crown lease, returned soldier's special holding, suburban holding, and 'ridap' settlement purchase.

I am taking up a block of grazing land as a homestead farm. It is in New South Wales, and in ordinary seasons would carry from 1,500 to 2,000 sheep comfortably. The tenure is as follows:—It is a lease in perpetuity, and is not transferable, excepting by mortgage, until after five years residence and then not without the consent of the Minister of Lands. Five years residence is necessary, and must commence within six months after the confirmation of the farm. Five years after confirmation, a grant (title) will be issued by the Crown.

A survey fee is payable by the lessee, but may be payable in ten instalments carrying 4 per cent interest. The first is made at the time of application, and the balance in nine yearly instalments.

BOLSHEVISM

Will it Become a Force in England?

To the Editor, E.A. STANDARD.
