World's News by Cable.

Education Bill.

Passes Second Reading. May 22. The House of Commons have passed the Second Reading of the Education Bill by 215 votes.

More Hard Fighting.

May 22. Willocks' camp was attacked at midnight on the 21st. The enemy in the most daring manner forced its way through the defenses and fought up to the breastworks where were located. On the 24th a heavy night attack was made on the camp which was strongly posted. Frequent charges with the sword and lost over 200. Lieutenant Sule of the 2nd Cavalry and Lieutenant Archibald of the 2nd Infantry were wounded and natives killed and 20 wounded. While the British had died from cholera.

Willcocks Advancing.

May 22. General Willcocks has advanced to the front some of his troops now showing the white flag and begging to be allowed to accept Willcocks' terms.

It is officially announced that Major Macleod, of the Scots Fusiliers, has been accidentally killed in General Willcocks' camp.

Willcocks Routes Enemy.

QUESTIONS IN PARLIAMENT. May 22. Willcocks attacked and routed some of the enemy at Umanba.

Reporting on questions by Sir Henry Cotton and others Mr. Buxton stated that the Government proposed to send a commission with the status of a neutral to the position of the tribes. He hoped the operations would be completed in a few days and the tribes withdrawn.

Collapse of a Large Airship.

May 22. At Oakland, California, during the trial trip of the Moored airship which is the largest in the world being inflated and prepared for flight at a height of 10,000 feet the occupants are seriously injured.

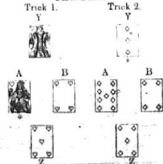

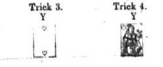

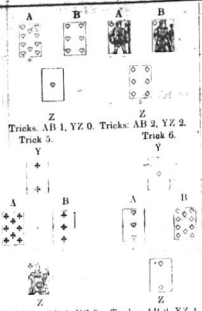
