The Education Bill.

Reconciling Forces.

June 15.—A Conference of the representatives of the different Denominations was held at Manchester which reached an agreement on the Education question involving due regard to minorities.

Mr. Asquith at the National Liberal Club said that Government was not pushing the Education Bill at present, as it was believed that reconciling forces were now at work which in time would produce an everlasting settlement.

Death Sentence of Murderer of Kennedy.

June 15.—At Muzaffarpur, the murderer of Kennedy has been sentenced to death, and native official charged with abetting was acquitted.

Germany on the Royal Meeting.

June 13.—There are comments in the German Press about the meeting at Heval to the effect that, while changes in European Politics, especially with regard to Macedonia are foreshadowed by the meeting, they might naturally excite anxiety, the emphatic assurance on peace made by the monarchs is destined to dissipate fears.

Power will Need to Reconsider.

June 13.—Mulahad's entry into Fez seriously affects the situation in Morocco and will probably oblige France and the other powers to reconsider the position.

Anti-Gambling Legislation.

June 13.—The New York State Legislature has passed a Bill making gambling on racetracks a penal offence.

Triumph of the Pretender.

June 16.—The troops at Azizah have continued and the Alcazar has proclaimed Mulahad Sultan. Mulahad's adherents have captured the Algerian Army instructors at Alcazar and sent them in irons to Fez.

June 18.—The Algerian Army Instructors who were captured on 15th instant were liberated and joined some other Frenchmen who had taken refuge in the house of a European at Alcazar.

An Interesting Ceremony. An Ordination at Nairobi.

[CONTINUED FROM "MILWAU"]

Yesterday will always be looked back upon as a great occasion in the history of Nairobi, and in fact, by others in the country. To begin with, the celebration of the Feast of Corpus Christi was transferred from the previous Thursday, and the ceremony was held on Monday, the first anniversary of the Holy Trinity for the Redemption of the Captives.

This order dates back to the middle ages, to the time of St. John de Matha and St. Felix of Valois, who in 1213, was known as the Order of the Holy Trinity for the Redemption of the Captives. Members of the order had to be men, that they were prepared to swear, and assume the chains of captives in order to effect their release.

The particular mission from which the first great order in the history of the world, as many of your readers are Catholic, looks in the ritual are scarce, it may be of interest to them to know what set the order.

Bishop Alloger, of Zanibar, conferred the office, being assisted at the High Mass by the Reverend Father Goetz, the Rector of the parish, as Assistant Priest; Father Bagnard, of the Kikuyu mission being Deacon, and Father Fausan, of Kiangani, as Sub-Deacon, while the Master of Ceremonies, the Rev. Dr. St. Father Richard attended the postulant.

The Bishop, clad in purple robes, was processionaly led to the church, and entered by the West door. He was then publicly vested at the episcopal throne, which had been erected for the occasion. Mass began immediately, in the usual style, after the Epistle, when the Bishop, acting as Archdeacon, publicly announced the congregation, according to the form laid down in the Pontifical, to state any known cause why the ordination should not proceed.

The postulant was then called, and took his place in front of the Bishop, who addressed him as to the sanctity of the new days. The Litany of All the Saints was then sung by the assembled priest and then followed the imposition of hands. This part of the ceremony was most impressive, the Bishop first, and then each priest in turn silently placing their hands on the new priest's head. A long prayer was then sung, and the stole, which had been worn deopwise, was placed over both shoulders, and crossed in front. He was then vested in the Cassock, the back of which was, however, folded. The "Veni Creator" was then sung, and the consecration of the bread, with the Holy Oil followed.

The power of offering the Holy Sacrament was then given, and the Gospel was read. A Sermon was preached by the Rev. Father Goetz, who looked at his hearers as "Priest for ever" from the Psalms. In it he pointed out the indelibility of the orders then being conferred, which made the postulant a Priest for ever, and from this he enlarged his subject, and spoke as to the indelible nature of the Catholic Church through her Priesthood. He also hoped that the spiritual grace, received that by the new Priest, would be, so to speak, extended to the good of his parishioners.

The Mass then proceeded in his usual way, except that all the prayers were said aloud by the Bishop, and the new Priest together with the Bishop. After the Communion, he made his profession of faith, and was given the power of receiving, and administering the Sacrament. This was now unfolded, to give the recognition of the full powers of a Priest. He pledged obedience to his Ordinary, the Pontifical Benediction was then given, and the Mass concluded.

A Confirmation followed, 31 candidates receiving this sacrament. The Bishop, in course of his address, used Swahili expressions in stead of the familiar Latin questions. He then returned to the Embassy in possession of the Cape, and Mito, and carrying his pastoral staff.

I have been present at most of the great services in London for many years past, and few have been privileged to be present at any that the smoothness, and precision, with which everything was carried out on Sunday, reflects the greatest credit on all concerned.

LOCALLY ENGAGED OFFICIALS.

TO THE EDITOR OF "THE EAST AFRICAN STANDARD."

Sir,—The policy of the Government in the treatment of locally engaged men seems to me anything but fair.

A Government Official holding an appointment from home, is entitled after 21 years service, to 6 months leave, 3 months on full pay, 3 months on 2/3 pay, with a first class passage.

The locally engaged man is only entitled to 4 months leave on 1/2 pay, with a second class passage, and that only after serving for 2 years and 6 months.

This rule comes under an old Colonial notice in February 1862, when locally engaged men were all Indians and Chinese, and should now be done away with. It is ridiculous to think that because a Government Servant has saved the Eschagueer the amount of his passage money, that he should not be entitled to the same leave conditions as the man who came out at Government expense.
