In the Legislative Council on Monday afternoon Sir C. G. Hoaring (Chief Secretary) brought up a matter which he thought should be put before the Council. It was with regard to the revised salaries of civil servants. 





IMMEDIATE APPLICATION OF REVISED RATES

A special meeting was held by the Governor Thursday morning in the Government office, except in such cases as the Members of the Legislative Council require any officer to conduct any official business being excluded during any absence from duty. It is understood that the Governor will not be present in person during the discussion of Civil Servants' salaries. The Legislative Council resumed its sitting at 10.40 a.m. when the Director of Agriculture moved that the Council go into committee to discuss the Ordinance to provide for the Cleaning of Cattle.

Every inspector shall have full power and authority to inspect the any estate at any reasonable time and to take a sample or samples comprising the contents of any dipping tank at any time. If the inspector for any reason suspects that the dipping tank is not being properly maintained, he may require the owner to produce a certificate of analysis and to retain one part in his own custody. Any person who fails to comply with any order of the inspector to enter upon any land or premises to examine the cattle or who attempts to hinder or attempt to impede or obstruct the inspector in the execution of his duties shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 1,000 or in default of payment to imprisonment for not exceeding three months.

THREE MONTHLY SAMPLES. A new Section 7, to be inserted in the Ordinance, providing that every owner shall forward to the Government Analyst at regular intervals of three months a dipping sample of the contents of his dipping tank for the purpose of analysis. Any owner failing to do so shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 1,000 or in default of payment to imprisonment for not exceeding one month.
