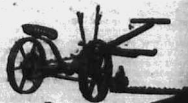

The E. I. Standard work has been heavy. (5) Ascertaining the opportu- nities for export of the produce of B.E.A. upon the market of the U.K. The Association has also provided: (a) A place where producers of East Africa and Uganda can meet and discuss their joint inter- ests and advantages of grading, with a view to the steel being used for other pro- duce. (b) A means of getting into the U.K. with organised schemes, and yet in the Federation of British India. WRANGLE'S WAR RUSSIAN TRADE TROTSKY'S ANXIETY NO ACTION YET

London, Oct. 5. General Wrangle's operations in South Russia have again come to a standstill. The situation is apparently developing most rapidly, and a big move in the line of the Russian Government is expected to be made in the near future. Simultaneously with the withdrawal of the Russian troops from the Don, the Russian Government has announced that it will maintain control of the Don and the Kuban. Trotsky's anxiety is evident from his recent statements. He has declared that the Government must take prompt action to prevent the Russian troops from being driven out of the Don and the Kuban. The movement proposed by the Russian Government is to a big Wrangle advance on the capture of Lwow and Slavutsk. The Bolshevik main committee in the Don has also been ordered to the Kuban area, while Ekaterinograd is metacred from the Don.

Wrangle announces that 11,000 troops have been counted in the Kuban area. He has also announced that he has received a report from a point 10 miles west of Mariupol, stating that the Russian troops are in a state of panic. 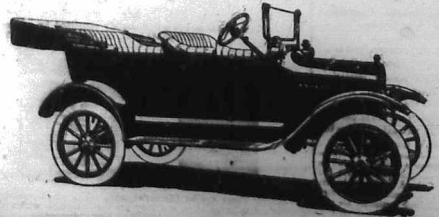

An Ordinance relating to the Service Ordinance 1913, has just been issued. The first amendment to the Ordinance is as follows: "The word 'any' shall include any other remuneration on a contract of service whether orally or in writing."
Section 5 now reads: "Notwithstanding anything in the principal Ordinance to the contrary it shall be lawful for an employer to employ a servant to engage in a contract of service either orally or in writing for a period not exceeding 30 days and such contract shall be deemed to be completed in 30 consecutive days and 30 days through which the servant is absent through illness (excepted therein) shall be included in the 30 days" and in the event of such a contract being in writing, it shall not be necessary to comply with any of the conditions prescribed by the principal Ordinance in the case of written contracts. Any contract not complying 30 days' work within the 30 days' period shall be deemed to have constituted an offence and shall be deemed to have exceeded the amount due to him under the said Ordinance and in default of payment to implement of either description for a period not exceeding one month."

It is stipulated that His Excellency the Governor has summoned a meeting for Thursday next to discuss the question of transport in the Eastern Province.
