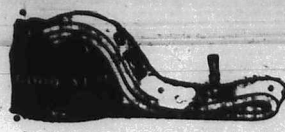

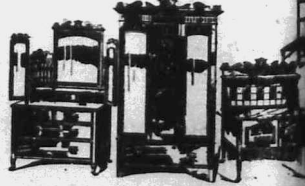
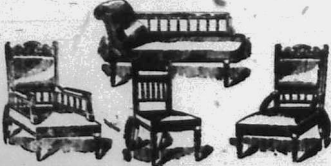

ALLIES CONFER

Position of Greece Causes Anxiety.

FRENCH ATTITUDE.

London, Nov. 23. Pending the arrival of Signor Sforza (the Italian Foreign Minister), the members of the Anglo-French Conference are endeavouring to reconcile the divergence of views which is undoubtedly existing as regards the Greek situation. Latest reports are optimistic on this matter.

The French have apparently been desirous for the revision of the Treaty of Sevres, to Greece's considerable disadvantage, as the outcome of the turning down of the Venizelos régime. Such a revision would favour France's aspirations in the Near East.

Italy has been somewhat similarly influenced. In the contrary, British statesmen regard the Treaty as representing definite Allied policy in the East and contented the situation which engaged so much time and attention should be maintained, if and while the Greek Government adheres to Venizelos's régime.

The question of the pro-Germanism of the ex-King Constantine is regarded as a dead donkey and signifying nothing in the present circumstances; indeed it is understood that the Allies have abandoned the idea of opposition to his return to the throne.

An authoritative French source in London states with regard to the Anglo-French Conference that it now seems probable that the Allies will take no step in the direction of the revision of the Treaty of Sevres but will demand from Greece the most serious guarantees against the return of German influence to Greece.

The course of preliminary discussions is satisfactory, and it is firmly believed that a definite resolution acceptable to all interested parties will be finally reached.

The Anglo-French Conference in London has been interrupted. M. Leygues is leaving for Paris in the morning of November 29, in order to make a statement to the Chamber with regard to the French representation at the Vatican, but before leaving he will see Signor Sforza, who is due to arrive in London this evening. It is hoped that M. Leygues will return to London on December 2 or 3.

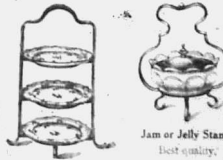
