INDIANS IN EAST AFRICA. Concluding Portion of Despatch from Govt of India

ROYAL COMMISSION SUGGESTED

On January 10 we published the despatch of the Government of India's important despatch on the Indian situation in East Africa, dated October 21, based upon the recommendations made by Sir Benjamin Robertson. To-day we are able to publish the concluding portion of the despatch, the whole of which appeared in the "Gazette of India."

Land Policy.

COUNCIL'S DECISION

Mr. A. C. Hoey (Nairobi, South) raised the following motion during Monday morning's session of the Legislative Council.

"That in the opinion of the Veterinary Department should remain under the Director of Agriculture."

Mr. Hoey said that he had been asked to help thinking for the welfare of the Colony that this question should be decided as soon as possible.

Both Departments played an important part in the development of the Colony. Stockbreeders had had an ample opportunity to study the subject. His Excellency had given the widest possible publicity to the correspondence on the subject.

In his Excellency's special meeting of the local societies had come to the conclusion that the Veterinary Department should be under the head of the Agricultural Department.

The Veterinary Department officers have formed part and parcel of the Agricultural Department.

Continuing, Mr. Hoey strongly urged the need for a reconciliation between these two Departments. This co-ordination could not exist if the two Departments were separated.

In the event of any appeal, His Excellency would probably be obtained before a decision was arrived at.

Sir Northrup McMillan (Ukamba) seconded the motion, and said he had in mind the reactions of the various districts he represented in view of the motion.

An Amendment. The Director of Education said he wanted to move an amendment to the motion. It was extremely difficult matter for any kind of Department to disorganize the departmental administration he had in mind.

He hoped the Council would not agree to a motion until His Excellency had received a dispatch from the scientific officers of the Colony.

FIRE AT LIMURU.

(Natives suspected of setting fire to European Residence.)

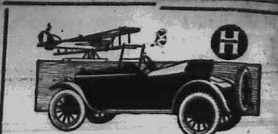

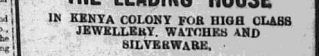

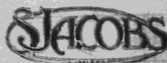
