WORLD'S NEWS BY CABLE.

Pessimism in Vienna.

Servia Strengthening her Reserves.

Servia's Note.
 March 12.—The text of Russia's note to Servia on 2nd instant, and the latter's circular to the powers of 10th instant, is published in Belgrade and Servia therein dwells on the legality of her attitude since the annexation and her desire to maintain good neighbourly relations with Austria-Hungary. She points out that the question of Bosnia and Herzegovina being international the powers must decide. Pessimism in Vienna is said to add that the Servian note is based on the justice of the Powers and does not claim compensation from Austria-Hungary.

Vienna not Satisfied.

March 14.—Vienna is not satisfied with the fact that the Servian note ignores Austria's last communication, but it is felt that the way is made smoother for peace though the negotiations are likely to be protracted and difficult.

The Austrian Government consider that the note lacks the formalities essential to an improvement of the situation, and complains of the omission of all reference to Servian armaments and direct negotiation. The claims, instead of being withdrawn are merely transferred from Austria to the Powers.

March 16.—Pessimism is more accentuated in Vienna owing to the signing of the second and third lines of Servian Reserves. The press is increasingly impatient and demands prompt clearing up of the situation.

March 16.—The Servian reply to the Austrian note of 6th inst. which maintaining a desire for friendly relations on the basis of reciprocity proposes that Austria-Hungary should submit a Servian Commercial Treaty to Parliament and if unable to secure its acceptance before 31st the date of its expiry Servia will be prepared to prolong the existing provisional regime until 31st December.

The Servia reply has depressed the Bourses and there is a slump in Berlin where an Austrian ultimatum is feared.

March 17.—Austria who regarded the Servian note as evasive and almost impudent will answer demanding specific promises of her peaceful intentions.

No More Squandering.

Budget Deficit in France.
 Mar. 16.—The result of the compromise on the French Navy Estimates is that Picard furnishes guarantees against squandering money on the Navy.

A Protracted dispute took place between the French Minister of Marine and Minister of Finance on the subject of the Navy Estimates, the former originally demanding 250 million francs compromised for 180 Millions spread over 60 years.

The deficit in the Budget chiefly due to the Navy is 150 Millions.

March 14.—A letter written was brought by Mr. Lloyd George to the proprietors of the 'Newspaper' for publication. It was a reply to a letter from the proprietors to settle a divorce suit which was alleged to be in the hands of Mr. Lloyd George. The letter shows that it was not a personal attack on the character of Mr. Lloyd George, but a statement of the facts in the latest manner possible.

Bottomley Acquitted.

Complains at Method of Prosecution.

March 14.—The case against Mr. Bottomley concluded with his making a strong speech in his defence and bitterly complaining of the methods of the prosecution. He explained fully the various Company operations and emphasis of that witness after which the Magistrate said it was a case in which no jury could convict and would grant a free discharge. He dismissed the summonses against the four defendants. A fresh sense of enthusiasm took place outside.

The laying down of the following vessels: 20 Dreadnoughts, 20 Light Cruisers, 20 Destroyers, and 20 Torpedo Boats, estimated to cost £10,000,000, will be the main feature of the construction of an armament.

March 12.—The House of Commons was crowded yesterday. The Prince of Wales and many distinguished persons being present.

Mr. McKenna in introducing his estimate said that the safety of the country must be maintained. Government was faced with a difficult situation, and the rate at which the German Navy construction was proceeding.

Mr. Asquith said he was glad to state that recent developments tended to improved relations but regretted that Germany made it clear that an arrangement for the mutual reduction of programmes was not what Germany was enormously developing her constructional equipment.

It is impossible to exaggerate the impression produced in Britain by the debate, coupled with Mr. McKenna's announcement that Germany already possessed fourteen ships of 17 Dreadnoughts and was constructing three more. A similar opinion is being made in the matter of submarines, &c.

The House of Commons Mr. McKenna said that it may be found necessary in the course of the year to prepare for the rapid construction of four more large armoured ships and six for power to enter their armaments, &c., to enable them to be laid down in the first of April 1910 and completed by March 1912.

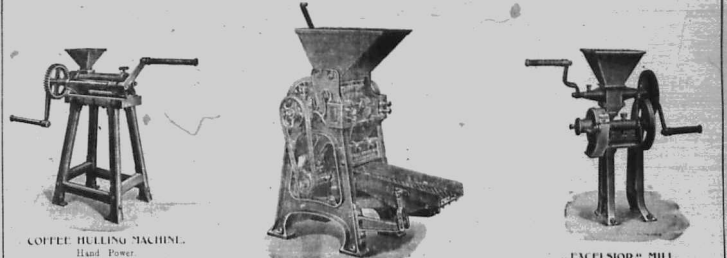

World's News by Cable.

Servia Discarded.

March 19.—Reuter at Belgrade learns that the representatives of the Powers will again discuss Servia in favour of peace and Servia is given to understand that in the event of war she will remain entirely isolated and cannot expect assistance from any quarter.

Better Feeling in Vienna.

March 20.—The Emperor Francis Joseph in a statement to the Hungarian Deputy said he was gratified that peace will be maintained. This has caused a more hopeful feeling in Vienna.

Servia Disbanding.

March 23.—Reuter at Belgrade states that according to the address of the Powers Servia will disband her reservists of Monday.

Naval Fatality.

March 22.—While the Workmen were leaving H. M. S. Vanguard at Barrow in Farnes a gannet was speared and many were injured. Three were killed and two injured.

The German Navy.

March 23.—The first German vessel of the Division of the Von der Tann is expected to be launched at Howitz.

The Navy Debate.

March 19.—In the House of Commons the debate on the Navy Estimates was held. The Navy Ministers argued the necessity of the increase but there was no alternative between scrapping the Navy and having it invaluable.

Frontal Attack.

March 20.—Mr. Balfour has given notice of a vote of censure declaring that the policy of Government regarding the immediate provision for Dreadnaughts does not secure the safety of the Empire.

The Empire and the Navy.

Mar. 23.—The Navy continues to be the chief topic. Reuter at Wellington (New Zealand) states that the Government has offered immediately to defray the cost of a Dreadnaught and if necessary another.

The Premier Fisher says that the Empire is only at risk awaiting to the question of defence.

Lord Crewe's Reply.

March 23.—Lord Crewe has replied to New Zealand in the most grateful manner and said that the Government would consider the offer immediately.

An Effective Navy.

March 24.—The House of Commons without dissent passed a vote for an effective Navy. Mr. Asquith denounced as absurd, mischievous and unparliamentary.

New Zealand Offer.

March 23.—The House of Commons Mr. Asquith read a telegram dated 14th inst. from the Prime Minister of New Zealand, expressing the warmest appreciation for the generous and patriotic offer of New Zealand. The Naval Estimates for the forthcoming financial year will afford no room for security but in view of the uncertainty respecting foreign affairs the offer to defray the cost of a battleship within the period, and another if necessary, is gratefully accepted. The House then adjourned.

The Eternal Near East Question

March 23.—The Balkan negotiations are hanging fire. The British Government has been unable to secure any agreement with the other Powers. The situation is becoming distinctly worse.

Great Britain and Austria.

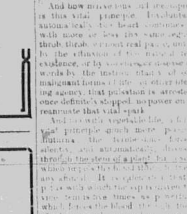
