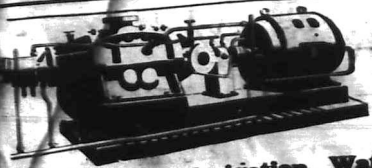

LAND BANKS

Last Year's Report on Urban Institutions

HELP TO FARMERS

The Land and Agricultural Bank in South Africa has been of great assistance to farmers in every way and work their own land and to the farming community in South Africa and as showing the wide and useful scope of its operations in assisting the following urban institutions to raise their loans from the Cape Trust of the 30th April 1921.

An amount of £100,000 in 1920 was advanced under Act No. 20 of 1918 from January, 1917, onwards, for the purpose of raising distress caused during the drought and flood in the districts of Abertree, Dundee, Helderberg, Jansenville, Murray, Oudtshoorn, Prins Albert, St. Michaels, Tzitzikon, and Willowmore in the Cape Province. The loans were made in 100 instalments of a special vote by Parliament and were repaid by the farmers out of their own pockets.

It was hoped to be able to report that the whole amount would have been repaid, but as the 31st December, 1920, an amount of £116,000 was still outstanding in respect of capital and interest, all of which is recoverable. This balance had not been recovered before the end of the year if extreme pressure had not been brought to bear upon delinquents.

### Allegation, Settlement and Development

#### S. A. METHODS.

In order to further the Agricultural Development of South Africa, Parliament passed in 1912 an Act known as "The Land Settlement and Development Act, 1912," which is better known as the "Land Settlement Act," with special but not sole reference to settlements on the land of the Government.

The Act provides for the allotment of Crown land for the acquisition of land by purchase or exchange, for settlement purposes, and empowers the Government to improve such land by carrying out any work that it may deem fit to do in connection with the settlement.

However, a new condition is now attached to institutions which in the past have been able to assist as now so longer able to do so to the satisfaction of the State.

The bank was, however, representative of the Agricultural Corporation of Port Elizabeth in October, 1910, and opportunity was taken then of pointing to the Congress the work of the bank.

During the year 200 applications were received for financing advances amounting to £25,771. The figure for the previous years are: 1912, 1913, £23,000; 1914, £27 for £26,000; 1915, £130 for £1,740; 1916, £1 for £23,000; 1917, £1 for £6,500; 1918, £1 for £312, 1919, £1 for £2,747.

The south-western districts have again experienced a good season. The boom in farm property set in early in the year and has continued to this time in many cases beyond previous positions. These high prices give rise to speculation, and in some cases are discouraged.

Great promise will be the coastal districts, but owing to drought, a short-fall is expected in the harvest when the harvesting season for the same reason has also been a failure. The drought has been followed by a phenomenal fall in the price of wool, which has also affected the farmers who have based their operations on the abnormal prices then ruling for produce which will be seriously affected.

The collapse in the price of wine and brandy has in some ways a dealer and farmer who should realize that the wine trade which took place was an artificial boom, and that the wine trade has been a failure for the last two years, and the prospect of satisfaction is only a distant one.

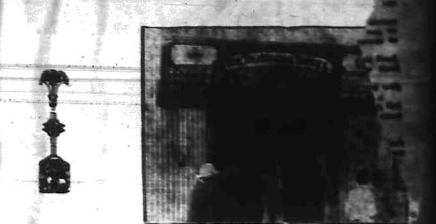
