The duty upon coffee entering this market has been reduced in the present Budget from 82 2s. to 28s. per 1000b. the preferential duty being 5,06 his of this amount. Advantage, as with tea, can be taken of the preference immediately, if the certificates of origin are in order, as the net duties are paid on the offee as it comes out of bond. In all-dutable goods the proportion of duty to ruing prices is important, as, of the duty is only a small fraction of the gross price. 1/6th of that duty as preference immont be vry effective. Coffee varies so much shat it is impossible to give vry definite figures, the last market quotations per cwi were, however, Santon. 70s. to 78s. Costa Rice, 80s. to 10b. Kenya, 60s. to 10s.; and Uganda. 60s. to 97s.

Demand Stimulates.

The production of coffee within the Empire has been affected by the general decline in the coffee market owing to the economic condition of many important European buying contents, and in the midst of these larger movements it is not safe to look upon production figures as having been much affected by the preference, though a distinct advantage has certainly been given in the markets of this country, and it is important to bear in mind that the whole Empire supply available for export is still 6,800 tons short of consumption here.





Strong representations were made against certain of the assessments decided upon by Government at the result of the indiangs of the 1915 call Commission appointed in 1915 to invasigate the claims for consensation in respect of Joses suntained during the disturbances in South Kavirondo during the month of September, 1914.

His Excellency in February of this year approved of the appointment of a Committee, comprising one of His Majesty's Puisses Judges as Chairman and the Associated Chambers of Commerce to revise the evidence and the Report furnished by the Special Commissioners and to make recommendations in those cases in which they considered the compensation swards merited an increase.

The Committee reported at the beginning of May and submitted Majority and Minority recommendations.

It is now announced that His Excellency, after weighing the various statements submitted, has decided to accept the recommendations of the Majority Report. It is to be understood that the claims now approved are final and subject to no appeal and is must be remaindered in this connection that the compensation granted is purely as act of graces and that no legal obligation for such a concession has been or is now admitted on the part of Oovernment.




