EFFECT OF PRIME MINISTER'S SPEECH.

VICEROY'S EXPLANATIONS.

[THROUGH BRYTER'S AGENT.]

Bombay, August 21.

All shades of Indian political opinion are agitated over Mr. Lloyd George's speech on August 2 which is being made the rallying point in an attempt to unite extremists and moderates.

Unofficial members of the various Legislatures are giving angry replies to the Press, labelling resolutions in condemnation of the Legislature.

An influential deputation comprising members of the Council of State, the Legislative Assembly, and the Provincial Councils, and others is waiting on Lord Reading, declaring that the speech conflicts with previous official statements and is a negation of the basic principles on which premises of the ultimatum granting of Dominion status were based.

Simla, August 19. Lord Reading replied that the Prime Minister had authorized him to state that the speech in no way represented a departure from previous official declarations, but he merely desired to give a warning against a policy of wrecking by non-co-operation at the next election.

He suggested that inter-Allied debts should shortly be discussed in a conference of all concerned.

Not Noras or Bismarcks.

M. Poincare said that French Government adhered to the scheme of positive pledges submitted to the London Conference.

He hinted that eventually France would be reduced to taking pledges without the co-operation of the Allies but he declared she would only keep them until Germany consented to comply with her engagements.

He concluded by saying: "We are neither Noras nor Bismarcks; we only ask to remain allies of our allies and friends of yesterday and to resume with yesterday's enemies peaceful and courteous relations, but we stipulate that our reparations demands shall be satisfied, and they shall be."

ITEMS FROM FRANCE.

A DOUBLE BURDEN FOR VINE GROWERS.

Paris, August 20. Four melons have been prosecuted by the anti-crucifixity to Animal Society for killing eight bulls at Bordeaux on July 14. They were fined 15 francs.

The list has caused widespread forest fires in the South of France. Cardinal Leger, Archbishop of Rheims, has been made an Officer of the Legion of Honour.

ROUND THE WORLD

ANXIETY FOR SAFETY OF BRITISH AIRMEN.

Calcutta, August 21. There is anxiety for the safety of Major Blah's colleagues of whom no news has been received since they left 30 hours ago for Akhoy.

There was a bad cyclone on Saturday in the Bay of Bengal and search parties are being despatched.

AN AIR MARVEL

GERMAN INVENTION OF MOTORLESS AIRPLANE.

A YACHT.

[THROUGH BRYTER'S AGENT.]

London, August 21.

The epoch-making character of flights of motorless aeroplanes or sail-planes in the Rhine hills in Germany is clearly shown by the details received.

Herz Hennessy, a young engineering student, accomplished his two hours flight in a one-decker sail plane, the largest machine at the meeting competing for a prize of 100,000 marks offered by the German aeroplane industry.

He cruised in all directions at a height of 600 feet for an hour and three-quarters passing the starting point repeatedly. He then flew over six miles in a straight line making a perfect landing.

Another pilot flew for over an hour. These sail-planes may be described as air yachts and are designed to utilize the wind, for ascending and descending and advancing with or against the wind.

Herz Hennessy subsequently declared that a longer flight was not now a matter of the machine but of nerve on which a great strain was put.

TO CARRY TROOPS

NEW USE FOR AIRPLANES IN TROPICS.

[THROUGH BRYTER'S AGENT.]

London, August 21.

It is understood that the first of two troop-carrying aeroplanes that are being built will probably be tried in Mesopotamia.

The machines which will accommodate 25 fully equipped soldiers are intended for use in tropical parts of the Empire to obviate forced marches through hot, arid country.

U. S. A. TARIFFS

THE SENATE'S FOUR MONTHS' DEBATE ON BILL.

Washington, August 20.

The Senate passed the Tariff Bill after four months' debate by 48 votes to 25. The Bill now goes to a conference of the two Houses.

BAVARIA

SUCCESSFUL CONFERENCE HELD IN BERLIN.

Berlin, August 21.

Newspapers state that German Cabinet Ministers and Bavarian delegates have agreed in regard to the dispute in respect of laws for the defence of the Republic.

The delegates have returned to Munich, where the decision now lies.

They have issued a joint statement urging the transfer of the control of the mission funds in Africa from the mission authorities to the Bishops. A suggestion is made in the case of India.

THE WORLD'S RUBBER

GREAT AMERICAN SCHEME OF SYNDICATION.

\$50,000,000 CAPITAL.

[THROUGH BRYTER'S AGENT.]

London, August 21.

The Planconer outlines an American proposal to form a corporation called the Rubber Plantations, Limited, registered in London with an authorized capital of \$50,000,000 to acquire rubber estates in each of the rubber-growing countries to be operated through agents as at present with a possible re-grouping of interests to secure efficiency and economy.

Representatives of the plantation and rubber industry will be invited to confer with American rubber interests in regard to the situation.

AMERICAN LABOUR

LEADER AND PRESIDENT HARDING'S INTERVENTION.

[THROUGH BRYTER'S AGENT.]

Washington, August 20.

Mr. C. C. Clegg has made a statement that President Harding's message had added to the difficulties of the industrial situation. The Federation of Labour would oppose any suggestion to carry out the President's suggestion that the Railway Labour Board should be empowered to enforce its decisions.

AUSTRIA'S PLIGHT

AN APPEAL FOR MID-EUROPEAN SETTLEMENT.

[THROUGH BRYTER'S AGENT.]

London, August 20.

The unpropitious attitude of the Allied Conference towards the Austrian request for further assistance is manifestly responsible for Chancellor Leopold's significant announcement yesterday that the Austrian Government had entered into communication with Berlin, Rome and Prague for a readjustment of the Mid-European question.

The deplorable state of Austrian finances may be deduced from the fact that a million crowns now cost less than three shillings.

CANADIAN STRIKE

Sydney, Nova Scotia, Aug. 21.

All pumpmen and maintenance employees on the mines in Southern Cape Breton, have returned to work pending wage negotiations which the Prime Minister has guaranteed will be resumed on Tuesday.

FATAL ACCIDENT ON THE BASTINGS ROAD.

London, August 20.
