Hindus Attack a Lady Missionary. August 5.—Renter at Bombay telegraphs that a party of Hindus charged in the Poona District and assaulted a mission house at Fanchar...

Reported Railway Amalgamation. Aug. 6.—It is reported that the Midland, London and North Western and Lancashire and Yorkshire Railways have completed an agreement with reference to complete traffic which it is estimated will save a minimum of £2,000,000 per annum.

A Great Bushfire. Exaggerated Reports. A Train's Perilous Journey. Thousands Homeless.

Aug. 5.—A bushfire has swept hundreds of square miles in the region of the Crow's Nest Pass in British Columbia destroying several townships. Thousands are homeless and 170 are dead and missing.

Aug. 6.—The number of deaths from the bushfire in British Columbia were exaggerated and the latest report gives them at about 70. The last train out of the region traversed sheets of flames as the cottages repeatedly caught fire. 400 refugees struggled into Nelson and relief stores are pouring in from all directions.

SMALL BACON FACTORIES AND THEIR USES.

Large Factories.
The following extracts from Mr. Douglas's Technical Leaflet are interesting. Mr. Douglas, an acknowledged expert says—
"Most of the bacon produced in the United Kingdom is cured in large factories, and until recently the historical fact would be entirely on the lines of private enterprise. Not suffering as a rule from lack of capital, bacon curing has naturally followed the usual course of business similarly situated. The individual business was limited to develop to the point where a change of ownership or administration took the smallest relation to the turnover, leaving the main share return on capital and, as a result, we have the large factory."

New Conditions.
Bacon curing on the large scale is not a very old art, but like everything else it is being revolutionized by change of conditions. Before the advent of artificial refrigeration the curing of bacon in hot weather was a very risky proceeding, but now the process goes on all the year round, in the hot weather when pigs are cheapest as well as in the pork season when, as a rule, they cost more. And now the day of the small, cheap refrigerating machines has arrived and economical power derived from low priced gas engines has put artificial gas making it possible, so far as those very important items are concerned, to place the small curing on a level with the largest. Thus, co-operation has set in and the surprising results obtained in Denmark are a standing exhibition of how capital may be replaced by co-operative credit."

Previous Small Factories.
Clearly the small bacon factory has frequently not been a success. It suffered from (1) insufficient capital (2) a badly chosen position where it had to compete with pork butchers for its supplies of raw material, and (3) the lack of modern equipment. But it seems worth while to consider if the system has not arrived for a fresh trial in the system under new conditions."

Proposed Small Factories.
The small factory should be run by farmers, pig breeders, and others interested among the population of the district in which it is situated, and its capital should be wisely distributed among those so possessing. No effort should be spared to get hold of all the right people and to make such arrangements as will secure their loyal support of the enterprise. The size of the factory should be governed by the circumstances. It is very important to secure a good market for offal, and the best market is in the local one. Pig offal is a cheap and good article of food, and there is a considerable demand for it. This type of factory can pay cost and selling, packing and carriage to the distant market. It will obtain a much smaller price than can be had for the fresh article, but the counter locally. (2) The factory should, if possible, provide a market for all suitable articles raised in its district. As the cost of factory would be very nominal the small factory which possibly has to draw its supplies from a distance can be given effect by, we believe they will more than balance the advantage possessed by the large factory in the matter of merit and administration, especially when it is remembered that its connection with co-operative factories some at least of the administration is done without remuneration."

Cost of Small Factories.
We speak from our own experience when we say that a factory to handle over 50 pigs a week, can be built and equipped with a complete modern plant for about a thousand pounds, one to deal with 100 to 200 pigs weekly would cost under two thousand pounds. The working capital would depend on the credit given, but it need not amount to a very large sum."

Disposal of Produce.
It is always easy to find agents to sell good bacon, but the small factory system could take risk it would no doubt be desirable to have a central wholesale society to grade and dispose of the produce of all the factories."

Analogy of the Creamery.
The great development of the co-operative creamery movement, especially in Ireland, supplies an example of what may be accomplished in the bacon trade. Indeed the bacon factory ought to follow the creamery, as probably the most profitable one to which can be put the producing—separated milk—band. The difficulty of the bacon plant is that the two industries should certainly go hand in hand. The difficulty of the small bacon factory might have to face first, the co-operative creamery, but the experience of competent man content with well treated remuneration, turns up when it is wanted. Wherever a creamery is successful, a small bacon factory ought to succeed."

Large v. Small Factories.
In what has been written above, it must not be understood that anything is said against large factories. They have their

place and they will keep it. But the quantity of bacon produced in England is now a fraction of what the country once produced, it is relatively and it is steadily increasing, and it is very probable that it will increase the larger to grow more pigs, and to benefit all factories, large and small alike. And we should not expect small factories would take the trade of the larger ones, but that together they will be able to win back the bacon curing business we have lost."


