and was ordered to pay a fine
of Rs. 10/- and costs.

It was held that the teacher
had not been justified in
inflicting corporal punishment
on the boy.

The headmaster was acquit-

ted of negligence.



BACK FROM THE DEAD.

Five Men Rescued after Hope was Lost.

Five more startling stories have been told than that of the rescue of five of the miners entombed in the mine at Nyanza Goldfield in Stellville. Trapped by the incoming water, the men lay in their cramped prison for 10 days until they found a dry patch in their gloomy den, where they lay in silence, breathing through thin straws, until the miners came to the rescue.

Yet they kept up their spirits heroically. When the rescuers reached them they were still not dead, though benumbed and half-blinded by the heat of the mine. The men drank the River with their mouths open and then lay back again, but the miners took a bucket of cold water and washed them clean. They were still alive when they were rescued, and though exhausted and weak, they rallied well enough to complete the long journey home.

"SPEAKING FILM."

A New Invention Solves a Problem.

Two Danish civil engineers, Mr. JOHNSEN and Mr. ALFRED POULEN have demonstrated before an audience of prominent persons, a new method by which the "speaking film" is solved.

The human voice is photographed by a special method on a separate reel which is not connected with the picture film. It can be handled separately and can be synchronised with the picture film, giving a distinct advantage.

The same apparatus can be used for the ordinary motion picture.

The invention was much impressed by the results obtained.

Professor P. O. PEDERSEN, Director of the Polytechnic Institute of Copenhagen, has also worked with M. Valdemar Poulen (a pioneer of wireless telegraphy), and the two inventors have associated and the only possible combination has been arrived at.

The new process will be demonstrated in England and America in the near future.




