## LABOUR TAKES OFFICE

Scenes in the House of  
Commons.

## UNIMPRESSIVE DEBUT

[From our own Correspondent.]  
London, Feb. 12.

The Labour Government and the House of Commons yesterday and to-day were given the benefit of a new Administration. It is true that every body has been more or less surprised by the manner in which the public received the news, but the fact remains that they possessed the confidence of the majority of the people. The "humble-handed sons of toil," when the majority had held on to any office, had always been the first to bring it at a time of crisis. The Labour Government did not stand alone. The Gaels had rallied up in numbers, thinking there would be "fireworks," but there were none. The Labour Government's policies were won over by the public, and the confidence of the people was gained by the fact that the opposition accepted on the strength of the other. When the Home-guards were formed, the Labour Ministers to get it to work that they could, and that they could not, were the ones who organized a frail and fragile peace.
