



## KENYA BOY SCOUTS



### Notes and News from Home.

#### PRINCIPLES OF DISCIPLINE

Mr. Robert Baden-Powell tells the following story in the current issue of *Scouts' Life*, the official organ of the Boy Scouts of America:

A Boy Scout had been learning the principles in order to qualify for the Amritsar badge.

One day, making a group from his den, he went to see a soldier, a cavalry trooper who had been trained in India to ride a horse, jump over logs and carry out various tasks.

After a moment's hesitation, the Scout took out his jack knife and cut away the clothing around the soldier's leg, so that the Scout could see the level of the bone.

## MATHEMATICAL DANCES

(From Our Own Correspondent—Greece.)

PARIS, May 20.—The pack is now complete, and the Greek government has signed the peace treaty with Turkey, which it has taken to its advantage by giving some 300,000 Greeks to others, less recognizable than themselves. 
