OPHTHALMIA IN DOMESTIC ANIMALS AND ITS TREATMENT.



INFECTIOUS OPHTHALMIA

This disease is known as Acute Infectious Ophthalmia, or commonly amongst animal fanciers, as the 'Red Eye'. It occurs in all animals, particularly cattle, sheep, goats, and swine, in South America, and seems to be as prevalent in Australia as in Africa. It has been reported from Holland, India, the United States, Canada, and South Africa.

SYMPOMES

The disease symptoms of the eye are that there is a certain irritation if it has been exposed to the sun, and it may last for days and the water of the eye is generally very turbulent and turbulent. The lining membrane of the eye is affected by the swelling of the eyeball, with the result that the eye is closed. The swelling of the eyeball occurs, with the result that the eye is closed, and the eye is often swollen and the eyelids are closed.

The first thing is to take the disease in time. At first the eye is red and it is treated with a poultice. If this fails, then repeat again in a few days. Railway Tariff Points in Supreme Court.


