

## Absolution of Slavery

Sultan of Zanzibar has \_\_\_\_\_ signed decree, but considers it will greatly disturb Arab domestic life. Out of consideration for him it will not be promulgated till 6 July after he has left for Europe. Enquire whether consequently decree will be promulgated in 2 days on the same date.

June 1<sup>st</sup> was the date originally fixed  
for the simultaneous publication of the  
Slavery Decree in Zanzibar and the  
Abolition of the legal status of slavery  
Amendment Ordinance in the G.A.P.  
(see last par. of enclosure in F.O. 3023). It  
does not appear whether H.M. Agent in  
Zanzibar has let the O.A.G. of the G.A.P.  
know of the hitch with the Sultan, which  
has resulted in the postponement of the  
signature of the Decree and the amendment.

master without his consent shall sacrifice  
all such rights and privilege including  
the right to the custody of her children  
"by him"; & say that if the order has  
not already been passed, it should be  
brought into force on the 1<sup>st</sup> of July, when  
the Decree will be promulgated in Zanzibar.  
And send 7.0. a copy of our telegram.

With reference to my letter of the 26th ultimo  
(19279/09) respecting the steps to be taken to effect  
the final abolition of slavery in the British East  
Africa Protectorate and Zanzibar, I am directed by  
Secretary Sir E. Grey to state that he has been in  
telegraphic correspondence with His Majesty's Agent  
and Consul General at Zanzibar on the subject.

Mr. Clarke reported that the Sultan agreed to  
sign the Decree but considered that even as amended it  
would greatly disturb Arab domestic life. His High-  
ness therefore asked that out of consideration for him,  
it should not be promulgated until after he had left  
for Europe which he proposed to do on the 4th July.

Sir E. Grey on Mr. Clarke's recommendation has  
agreed to the promulgation of the Decree being deferred  
until July 6th and Mr. Clarke has reported that the
