

My Lord,

With reference to the correspondence relating to the provision of a substitute for the Protectorate Steam Ship Juba ending with Your Lordship's despatch No. 773 of December 28th last, I have the honour to report that the matter might be allowed to stand over for a time.

2. The coastal service maintained by Messrs. Cowasjee Dinshaw is certainly not ideal but it meets our immediate requirements and I think that only in the case of its being found necessary to send troops along the coast would it be needful to supplement it. Should such a contingency arise I do not anticipate any difficulty in chartering a suitable vessel.

3. I shall however carefully watch the development of coast trade and should it expand in any noticeable degree I shall not fail to make such recommendations to meet the requirements of merchants as may seem desirable.

4. As regards the officers of the Juba, I have




