My Lord,

In October of last year Mr. Ainsworth,
Provincial Commissioner, Nyanza Province, brought to
my notice that the boundary between the Uganda and the
East Africa Protectorates was not at all satisfactory.

2. Originally of course what is now the Nyanza
Province lay entirely in Uganda, but in 1902 when it
became part of this Protectorate the need for fixing a
boundary arose and in that year and in 1905 and 1908
various lines were defined and recognized.

3. As long as our sphere of influence was confined
to the vicinity of Government stations these boundaries
served their purpose, but now that the tribes right on the

frontier itself are in close touch with the Administration difficulties have arisen.

4. I accordingly instructed Mr. Ainsworth to proceed in conjunction with the Uganda Authorities and took the opportunity afforded by my presence in Uganda to confer with the Acting Governor Mr. Boyle.

5. Mr. Boyle met me in every way and his attitude has greatly facilitated the settlement of the question.

6. The boundary originally proposed by Mr. Ainsworth has been scrutinized by the Director of Surveys and corrected technically and has met with the approval of the Acting Governor Uganda Protectorate.

7. It runs as follows:- The boundary of the Uganda and East Africa Protectorates between Victoria Nyanza and Lake Rudolph shall be as follows:-

" Commencing at the mouth of the Sio River it follows up that river to the point where the Sango stream enters the Sio. Thence it follows the Sango to the point where the Mamisa Sango Nipale Road crosses it. Thence it follows the above mentioned road to the point where the road crosses the Malaba river. Thence
