Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Fiddes' letter of the 29th ultimo (20490/1911) further respecting the proposed grant to married officers in the service of the East Africa and Uganda Protectorates, when accompanied by their wives and families, of a small allowance to compensate them for the increased cost of travelling to and from East Africa by the ships of the Union Castle Line.

In reply I am to request you to inform Mr. Secretary Harcourt that, in consideration of the facts now adduced, my Lords sanction his proposal that a married officer of either of the two Protectorates mentioned should, when accompanied by his wife or family to or from East Africa, be granted an allowance of £10 for the double journey or of £5 for the single journey, on the understanding that this concession will remain in force for so long only as the existing disparity in the rates of the various shipping companies continues.
