Sir,

Majesty's Treasury your letter of the 19th ultimo (19759) and the enclosed copy of a despatch from the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate further on the subject of the Quarantine Station at Zanzibar.

In reply I am to request you to inform Mr. Secretary Harcourt that in view of the explanations now afforded My Lords assent to the proposals put forward in the Colonial Office letter of the 1st June 1910 (14437/1910) viz.

- 1. That negotiations should be entered into with the Zanzibar Government with a view to reducing the contribution at present payable by the East Africa Protectorate towards the cost of the station to one half or lower. My Lords would prefer, however, that for the reasons explained in Their letter of the 21st June 1910 this contribution should be a fixed proportion based on ascertained expenditure from year to year rather than a constant sum.
- 2. That, should the negotiations be successful, a new station should be constructed in the Protectorate on a small scale to serve as an infections Diseases Hopital at a capital cost not exceeding \$1000 or £1250 as the case may be,

or

Under Secretary of State,

on the understanding that the annual charge involved for its upkeep will not be higher than £400. My Lords further assent to the proposal that one quarter of the contribution payable to Zanzibar should be borne by Uganda.

3. Should the negotiations fail, on the other hand, My Lords would be prepared to re-consider the advisability of erecting a fully equipped station on a suitable site on a scale sufficient to render the Protectorate independent of Zanzibar for quarantine arrangements; but in this event Zanzibar's claims to compensation would have to be taken into account and My Lords would of course require a detailed estimate of the cost (capital and annual) of the new building.
