Sir,

In deference to Mr. Secretary Harcourt's representations contained in Mr. Fiddes' letter of the 6th ultimo (20/13/1911), further respecting the staff of the medical department of the East Africa Protectorate, the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury will no longer withhold Their sanction to the proposal (1) that the whole of the existing establishment of European medical officers in the Protectorate (exclusive of the two district surgeons whose appointment was approved by Their Lordships' letter of the 26th June last) should be made pensionable and (2) that provision should be made in the estimates for 1912-13 for one additional permanent and pensionable medical officer.
