Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Sir C. Lucas' letter of the 12th ultimo (23403/11) and your letter of the 30th ultimo (28191/11) and the enclosed copy of correspondence with the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate relative to the improvement of the Uganda railway steamer service on Lake Victoria.

In reply I am to request you to inform Mr. Secretary Harcourt that, provided that he is satisfied as to the permanent character of the increase in traffic shown during the current year, My Lords will not offer in principle any objection to the expenditure of £33,000 on the lines indicated in the letters under reply.

The question of the provision of funds, however, appears to Their Lordships to offer more difficulty. While They are gratified to learn that the surplus of assets on the 31st March last so much exceeded expectations, They concur in Mr. Harcourt's view that this fact in itself cannot be held to justify an increase in the amount of gross expenditure authorised for the current year.

On the other hand My Lords cannot assent to the proposal of the Secretary of State to hypothecate to this service estimated surplus earnings on the railway, which may in fact never be realised.

In normal circumstances, therefore, They would consider that the whole expenditure in question should be provided in the Estimates for 1912-13 and succeeding years in the ordinary way. They realise, however, the importance of making an early start with the works in question, and They are willing to extend to the present proposals the concession recently made in the case of the additional vessels authorised for Lake Kioga. Accordingly, I am to say that, in so far as Mr. Harcourt is satisfied that expenditure cannot be deferred without serious injury to the Protectorate's interests, My Lords are willing that it should be met (within a limit of £20,000) during the current year from the Protectorate balances, but, as regards expenditure which would not ordinarily come in course of payment during the year or is not of an urgent character, They consider that there is no ground for exceptional action, and They request that provision may be made for it in the annual Estimates in the normal manner.

My Lords desire, however, that no expenditure or estimate in excess of the total limit of £20,000 for the new cargo boat and £6,000 for the new tug respectively may be approved without Their previous authority, and that They may be informed in due course of the actual cost of substituting oil fuel for wood on the existing vessels.
