Sir,

I have the honour to report that, owing to the congestion now existing in the vicinity of the harbour of Kilindini, it has become essential to arrange for temporary accommodation for stacking timber and coal pending the construction of the Deep Water Pier.

2. Timber is now being imported in large quantities, and owing to its offering a ready refuge for rats, there are considerable objections to stacking it in proximity to human habitations. It was also been thought advisable to import a large stock of coal, while the price of that commodity is reasonably low, as there is the possibility that the supply of wood fuel for the Uganda Railway may in the near future be inadequate to meet the demand.

3. The General Manager reports that to the North of Kilindini harbour, just below Magadi Point there is a sandy beach with unlimited available space where cargo could be discharged at all times. In view of the urgency of the matter I have therefore arranged for the construction of a siding connecting this spot with the Uganda Railway to be commenced immediately

immediately in anticipation of your sanction. The cost is estimated at £3,000 and funds can be found from the sum of £40,000 granted for immediate improvements at Kilindini.

4. This siding will be absorbed in the contemplated Harbour Works while, if the scheme now under consideration is abandoned, it will be all the more necessary. I trust therefore that you will approve my action in the matter.
