(Received, Colonial Office, at 4.55 p.m. 2nd December, 1918)

December and your despatch of 5th
November on the subject of the three general proposals
made to you from your letter of 5th November
subject to following remarks. Consider transfer
This should be completed within 3 years period
and certainly not to be extended beyond 7 years.
In the event of undertaking to be taken over value
of land leased by Government to company for pur-
pose of concession should be excluded from pre-
scribed price. Request you to send us final draft
agreement to be completed in before being executed.

stated that, having
regard to the
uncertainty of the future
rate of development of
the land, the expenditure
incurred, necessary to
commence with the auxiliary
plant, the time necessary
which must be allowed
for completion of a normal
programme, and the
period (30 months)

which would involve
the Company taking the
risk of the value of the
land necessary to cover
the expenditure during
the second year of
the period.

necessary for creation
of the full in the way
of a lease to the Company
to 5 years, and that it
would only be possible to
secure a lease for 7 years
if arrangements were
made for a possible extension
to 10 years should it
at any time prove the need
therefor that the extension

Scheme would not be
financially practicable
in the next 7 years. The
proposed scheme was
subsequently suggested that
a period of 7 years and a
half years should be
fixed upon before the
end of which time the
Company should be obliged
to decide definitely whether
they could transfer their
works to the State or not.

I am not aware of the
precise reasons which have
led you to recommend
that a lower limit than
ten years should be adopted,
but subject to your strong
opinion to me
I am inclined to think the 7 years
suggestion in this outstanding
scheme favourable
point might be accepted.
