Your telegram of 5th November preliminary enquiry has been made and strongly opposed to proposal of Uganda Government regarding collection systems because consider them opposed to interests of trade. With reference to paragraph 11 would be willing to agree to hand over to Uganda any customs duties which have been shown to have been shortpaid they but could not accept figures furnished without definite figures.
