In reply to your despatch No. 236 of the 13th of March and with reference to Head 21 (d) Abstract D regarding scales of salaries for the Superior Staff of the Uganda Railway provided for in the Estimates for the current financial year I have the honour to inform you that it has not been customary in the past to adopt the system of granting automatic annual increments to the staff of the Uganda Railway.
