I am directed by the Secretary of State to inform you that he has received a letter from this Department to No. 179, of the 2nd ultim., reporting his arrival in this country, of Mr. G. S. Barnes, the Local Medical Officer of the East African Protectorate, and to acquaint you, thru' the information of Mr. Secy. Lyttelton, that a telegram was received from the Acting Legal Auditor at Mombasa on the 29th inst. to the effect that the Medical Officer insisted on Mr. van de Velde, one of the Assistant Auditors, proceeding on leave of absence on the 29th instant, instead of returning in the Protectorate, as had been arranged, until February next.

The Senior Audit. Clerk, Mr. P. Vaz, is also understood to be absent from Mombasa, as, after a service of over six years & 10 months leave, he has been granted four months leave of absence to campaign in the present month and Mr. Hanson, the Assistant Auditor in Uganda - who otherwise might have been sent to the East African Protectorate - is also returning home on leave.

2. As in addition to the ordinary duties of the Legal Audit Department in this Service it will be necessary shortly to provide for the usual work of the Auditor or one of the Assistant Members of the East African Protectorate, the General Land, the Comptroller and the General Accountant, it is advisable, in order that these posts should not be allowed to fall into arrear, to des-

ignate the Secretary of State
as Acting Clerk.

Letters to about nine months and at the moment exceed a year. During this period the Auditor General proposes to pay him per annum.

4. Should the Secretary of State consider my proposals I am to request that the Cr. be authorised to issue the usual passage stamp, which at present arranged, is for Membran by the Deutsche Ost-Afrik "Prinzenregent" on the 3rd proxime.
