THE ABUSE OF OPIATES PREVENTION AMENDMENT ORDINANCE,STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The Bill entitled an Ordinance to amend the Abuse of Opiates Prevention Ordinance, 1913, has been passed primarily to remove the disabilities imposed upon Veterinary Surgeons by the absence of legal provision in the Abuse of Opiates Prevention Ordinance, 1913, to enable them to import, buy, possess, sell, prescribe and supply opiates for the purposes of their profession. A Veterinary Surgeon has been defined for the purposes of the Bill as a Fellow or Member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons as defined by the Veterinary Surgeons Act, 1901, Section 2.

2. The Bill was drafted in consequence of the Circular despatch from the Secretary of State of the 27th December, 1913, and has had a very lengthy consideration by the Board formed under the Drugs and Poisons Ordinance, 1908.

3. The opportunity has been taken to define a duly qualified analytical chemist. Attention was drawn to the absence of such a definition by the Secretary of State in his No. 1045 of the 9th December, 1913. The definition in the Bill has been adopted at the recommendation of the Principal Medical Officer and the Board appointed for the purposes of the Drugs and Poisons Ordinance, 1908.

4. The amendment to Section V Clause 4 of the Abuse of Opium Prevention Ordinance, 1913, has been made at the request of the Principal Medical Officer to render it clear that disposal by dilution should be entered in the book kept under Section 7 of the Ordinance.

5. The amendments contained in Clause 5 of the Bill are inserted in order that the construction of the provision may be free from doubt. The word "keep" used in the Ordinance of 1913 implies a continuous use of premises for opium or tobacco smoking. Such continuous use is difficult to prove in the circumstances which exist at many places in the Protectorate and it is considered that if the possession of opium smoking implements be an offence it should be an offence at any time to allow opium smoking on any premises.

6. Clause 6 of the Bill extends the power of search to an Assistant Inspector of Police. An Assistant Inspector is a European police Officer and in some places he is the principal subordinate police officer in the station. It is desirable from a police point of view that such an officer should have the power to exercise the right of search which may be conferred by a Magistrate under Section 14 of the Abuse of Opium Prevention Ordinance, 1913. The alteration in the law is free in my opinion from any objection.

7. The last provision of the Bill is a general Clause giving powers to Veterinary Surgeons and limiting the use of those powers to the purposes of their profession.

8. The Bill may in my opinion be assented to forthwith.

THE ABUSE OF OPIATES PREVENTION AMENDMENT ORDINANCE, 1916.COMPARATIVE TABLE.

1.	Short title.
2.	Definitions. The Institute of Chemistry of Great Britain and Ireland is, I am informed, the only body which provides for the training and examination of analytical chemists in those countries. The definition of a Veterinary Surgeon has been adopted from the Veterinary Surgeons Act, 1881.
3.	This clause extends to Veterinary Surgeons the power given by the Abuse of Opiates Prevention Ordinance, 1915, to Medical Practitioners and Dentists to import, purchase, possess, sell and prescribe opiates and the penalties for breach of the conditions under which such powers are exercised under the Ordinance.
4.	A provision that diluting an opiate shall be treated as compounding . For

5.	The Amendments in this Clause are in consequence of practical difficulties found by the police in obtaining conviction under S- ection 13 of the Abuse of Opiate Prevention Ordinance, 1913, in cases in which opium smoking is detected on premises.
6.	The extension of the powers of control to Assistant Inspectors is to facilitate the administration by the police of the provision of the Ordinance.
7.	A General clause dealing with the powers of a Veterinary Surgeon and the use of such powers.
