It is true that
when writing his report on 15/3/1 the
Govt had not learnt that the S/P
approved of that recommendation.
But quite apart from re-organization
questions, it is amazing that
any officer who is so unsatisfactory
in his retention is
undesirable should be allowed
to go on leave (and, for all
that the Govt he owes, to
resume duty in due course)
without a word being said
to the S/P about it.

That is especially so in the
present case, where an
officer is within a month
of completing his probationary
term. It is surely not
asking too much of me
to expect the Governor as a
matter of routine to
send us a report on the
officer to state of his own
accord whether he should
be confirmed or not.

Which we had better
draw the Governor's attention
to the matter, & to para 3 of the
report which he had been
asked to prepare on the case.
As regards leave, Mr. C. has
been given 6 months.
