SIR,

With reference to my telegram No. 122
of the 25th of April intimating the death of
Lance Corporal William George Tunstall of the
East Africa Supply Corps, I have the honour to
transmit herewith an application for pension
by that officer's widow, together with her
marriage certificate and the birth certificate
of the deceased.

2. The applicant states that she is
unable to produce birth certificates for herself
and her children, but that copies could be
obtained in England as she was born at Mere,
Wiltshire, on the 30th June 1861, and all four
children were baptised in the Parish Church
at that place.

3. In order to avoid delay I have not
insisted

insisted on the production of the birth certificates locally, and shall be grateful if you will cause copies to be obtained in England and attached to the application.

4. Mrs. Tunstall would appear to be eligible for a pension of 20^{s/-} per week, i.e. 15^{s/-} for herself and 5^{s/-} for one child, and I have approved of payment being made to her at this rate as from 23rd April, the day following that on which the deceased officer died, pending your formal sanction.

5. I shall be glad to know if any increase in the amount of the pension can be allowed in respect of the son, Brian Blatchford, who is stated to be slightly paralysed, if a medical certificate is produced to the effect that he is incapable of earning a livelihood.
