2. I understood from your despatch No. 276 of the 21st of April 1916, in which you approved the expenditure of £950 on the removal of as many buildings as possible from the old Quarantine site to the new, that the suggested arrangement for the African area had already been considered and accepted by Professor Simpson. The expenditure referred to in my despatch No. 274 of the 12th of May was inadvertently stated to be in respect of the removal and re-erection of the old quarantine buildings, whereas it was required for the establishment of additional buildings on the new area and could be regarded as a fair charge against Vote 14 Sanitation Division, Epidemics, etc.
