RESUME OF WAR DIARY

from 22nd July 1916 to 28th July 1916 (inclusive)

East African Force.22nd July.Lake Detachment report no change.1st Division report no change.2nd Division report no change.23rd July.Lake Detachment report no change.

1st Division. - Hannington's Column, operating in the area between Handeni and the Coast occupied Ngambo, Kadoto, the enemy retiring to the South towards Mkwabia. One white and a few askaris were taken prisoners.

2nd Division report that on the 22nd inst. the enemy were driven out of Tissa Kwa Meda, leaving three dead and one wounded at that place.

Navy. - A detachment from the fleet landed and occupied Pangani, without opposition, with orders to hold that place until the arrival of land troops.

24th July.Lake Detachment report no change.1st Division report no change.2nd Division report no change.25th July.Lake Detachment report no change.1st Division report no change.2nd Division report no change.26th July.Lake Detachment report no change.1st Division report no change.

2nd Division report from Aneti that Tschenseng Neck was occupied by one of his Columns, the enemy retiring in the direction of Metansia; our casualties two killed and two wounded.

Another of our Columns occupied Kaia with the loss of one wounded on our side. The German camp at this place was captured and seven askaris.

The 1st Mounted Brigade occupied Naju, without opposition, the enemy retiring on Membe.

27th July. Lake Detachment report no change.

1st Division report no change.

2nd Division report that at the engagement of Tschenens Neck on the 25th inst. seven dead German askaris were found.

Nyasaland Force. - General Northey reports that in the engagement at Lupemba, on the 21st July, Drester, late Governor of New Langenburg, was captured with others. Also, his force attacked on July 24th the bulk of the enemy's forces in a strong position at Malingali, 140 miles from New Langenburg, on the Iringa Road. After severe fighting, the enemy beat a hurried retreat, leaving in our hands a 10.5 cm. howitzer and two machine guns. Details of the engagement are not yet to hand.

28th July. Lake Detachment report that our troops occupied Ilola, on the 25th., driving out one enemy company. Enemy's casualties were one white killed, one wounded, seven askaris killed and two wounded. They were pursued towards Seke.

1st Division report no change.

2nd Division from Aneti report that mounted troops occupied Membe, on the morning of the 27th., the enemy retiring towards Niangalo; our casualties one British officer wounded.

The 7th South African Infantry occupied Melameia, on the 27th inst., capturing ten German whites and seven German askaris,

askaris, with arms and equipment. On the Saranda Road our forces occupied Mpondi, on the 27th instant, our casualties being seven killed and seven wounded. The enemy held strong position in dense bush.
