

ORGANISATION.

In all Branches this is the same as last year.

II. WORK OF PAST YEAR.

Superintending Staff.

Major L.H.P.I. King, R.E. has been on active service during the whole year.

TRIGONOMETRICAL & TOPOGRAPHICAL BRANCH.

The Staff have been on active service during the whole year.

Very little topographical work has been done; a certain amount of topo work has been received from Administrative Officers pertaining chiefly to tribal boundaries, and revision of certain details which had been compiled in the past from various sources.

I understand that a certain amount of revision work has been done by the various Military Officers in connection with the local campaign, but such work has not been received in this Department.

CADASTRAL BRANCH.

Almost all survey work has been suspended owing to demands made by the Military Authorities for men for the King's African Rifles, Transport and other branches of the Military Service.

Work of a very urgent nature only has been undertaken. A certain amount of field check has been necessary to finish off the Laikipia and other large allotment surveys carried out by Licensed Surveyors.

The surveys to be carried out under the provision of the Land Titles Ordinance are almost at a stand-still owing to lack of staff.

Very little demarcation work has been possible as there are two demarcators only employed; one demarcator has been on leave since the 10th January, 1917.

The total staff of Indian demarcators consists of three only.

One man (an Indian) was engaged but proved unsatisfactory, and had to be removed.

The standard of survey has been maintained whilst the output is increasing owing to more systematic methods being adopted; this is natural as most of the men were new to the work, and are now becoming more efficient through experience and training.

A certain amount of Township work has been done during the year. Such has usually been done at the request of the Medical and Administrative Authorities.

Generally every man is being employed in the Computing and Bounding Branch with a view to wiping off arrears, and to cope with public demands for land transfer surveys all of which undergo examination in the Survey Department.

Dear Licensed Surveyors are engaged on private work continuously, chiefly subdivisional work consequently a large number of comparatively small areas are changing hands.

Such subdivisional work naturally entails a considerable amount of examination, and it is with difficulty the Department is able to keep pace with the demands.

I am pleased to note that Licensed Surveyors generally show signs of conforming more closely with the Departmental Regulations in regard to methods of survey, recording in Field books, computations and the necessary checks, beaconing and breaking down the local triangulation, which considerably facilitates examination in this Department, and reduces delay and consequent annoyance to the public, to a minimum. Much of the delay in the past was not owing to shortage of staff so much as by the necessity of returning plans etc., to Licensed Surveyors for amendment, check survey and to furnish further data, generally omitted in the Field notes or computations.

After a careful examination of Nairobi surveys I find that a complete rectification survey will be required as soon as it is possible to do the work. Nairobi has been laid out piecemeal, and the old work was not connected to any other previous work. Much of the work was badly done, and as most of the boundary marks have now disappeared, it is difficult to decide whether encroachment has occurred, or whether any particular plot was badly laid out.

I have already pointed out in previous reports the trouble which must be experienced owing to the removal of the boundary marks by property owners when about to build or fence.

In most Colonies the owners generally preserve the marks erecting fences in such manner that no disturbance is necessary, and when about to build employing a Licensed Surveyor to verify the boundary marks, and set substitute marks for the guidance of the builder, thus ensuring against encroachment. The public in this Protectorate do not seem to respect boundary marks of any description, and I am convinced they will not until legislation is enacted to prevent removal of boundaries. In new townships, as now laid out, the removal of boundary marks is not so objectionable, as standard bases are laid down in every street to which every boundary mark is referred. The intersections are demarcated by a block of concrete 18" X 12" X 12" set under ground to a depth of 18 inches to 24 inches.

An iron bar is set therein with a centre point mark thereon to denote the actual intersection.

Such base lines are parallel to the property alignments.

A Surveyor re-establishing or verifying any property boundaries works directly off the Standard, ignoring boundary marks.

The saving in time by adopting this principle is enormous, particularly so to Government as off-times plots are laid out some years ahead of sale.

Frequently the whole of the plots in a township are not purchased at Auction - the unsold plots may be standing vacant for some years; the boundary marks are frequently removed, knocked out, or lost.

The Surveyor re-establishing simply works off the Standard, and compares with base, provided if ever boundary lines get lost, he would have to work off such boundary points as are left, off-times finding that it is necessary to work back from some distance away; in addition there is somewhat doubtful if the points available are sufficiently reliable.

Computing Branch.

The work of this Branch has been considerably curtailed owing to several members being away on Military duty, others having resigned, or on leave. I have been able to secure the services of one Licensed Surveyor to assist in examination work.

The output of work per man monthly has considerably increased over that of previous years, chiefly owing to the large number of subdivisions dealt with, the better allocation of work, and Surveyors complying with the Regulations to a greater extent than in the past. Considerable time is still lost by Computers having to break off during the process of checking to attend to other urgent checking work.

This will be reduced to a minimum in the course of time as it is anticipated that all work will be brought up to date, consequently the necessity to break off and attend to other work will cease. All work will be attended to in order of priority, and very little delay will be experienced by the public.

Much yet remains to be done before the up-to-date stage arrives.

Triangulation Charts on 1/125,000 scale with tabulated lists of Co-ordinates have not yet been completed nor can the work be proceeded with until conditions resume the normal.

A vacancy created by the transfer of one man to the Bacteriological Department was filled by the transfer of a Draughtsman.

One Vacancy caused by resignation has not yet been filled.

Mr. J.H. MacEwen, a Senior Computer, was transferred from the Computing Office to act as Chief Draughtsman, and has given complete satisfaction.

Drawing Office.

The work of this Branch has proceeded very satisfactorily.

The Chief Draughtsman - Mr. Panting - joined the King's African Rifles on January 29th 1917.

The Cadastral Charts have been kept up to date.

The preparation of Deed plans is up to date also - very little delay being experienced.

Clerical Branch.

This Branch has been very severely handicapped owing to lack of staff, there being one European only assisted by two Coloured clerks. Mr. Balmer, who is Agt. Office Superintendent, has been compelled to work overtime every day, including Saturdays and Sundays.

The work of this Branch has not materially decreased since the war broke out.

The correspondence, inwards and outwards, is almost the same as in pre-war days.

The only vital difference is in the issue of stores. In this Sub-branch there has been a marked decrease in the work owing to the absence of Surveyors on Military duty.

I append schedules showing the output of survey work, cost per acre of work carried out. Plans and Maps sold etc., which I trust will be sufficiently explanatory.

In conclusion I beg to record with regret the death of Mr. H.S. Survey, Asstt. Junior Staff Surveyor. Mr. Survey received a Commission in the Army Rifles, and

and was killed in action.  
He was a very promising officer, capable and painstaking,  
and reliable.  
His loss is a severe blow to the Department.
