(a) Active service. Paragraph 6 is now worded so that while no cut and dried definition of 'active service' which would only lead to discussion is necessary, it is quite open to the Selection Board in view of the last sentence, to make their own working arrangements and if they desire, to reject anyone who has not actually seen fighting. Cannot further explain. I think Lord Curzon would agree that it is better to leave it open to the Board to decide cases on their merits than to attempt a definition which has been seen in other cases and not satisfy everybody.
